Last Sunday we lit four candles to remind ourselves of (Each candle is lit as the reader speaks)

First Candle - Jesus The Son of David

Second Candle - Jesus Prince of Peace

Third Candle - Jesus Lamb of God

Fourth Candle - Jesus Son of God

Today is the fifth Sunday of Advent and we will light a candle to remember Jesus as Immanuel, God with us.

Scripture Matthew Chapter 1:18 This is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about: His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be with child through the Holy Spirit. Because Joseph her husband was a righteous man and did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her

quietly. But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: "The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel" --which means, "God with us."

Commentary

God had come close to people throughout history, through prophets and priests. Now Matthew quotes the words of the prophet Isaiah to tell us that Jesus was no mere prophet, in Jesus God had actually come to dwell with the people. Jesus was not a messenger sent from God, now God had come in person. The Gospel of Matthew begins by reminding us God come to us in this unique and special way as Jesus Immanuel. The Gospel of Matthew closes by reminding us that Jesus is still among us today and he will continue to be 'until the end of the age.'
