Act of Penitence

Minister:

Minister: Almighty God have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and keep you in life eternal; through Jesus Christ our Lord, **Amen**.

Act of Remembrance (all standing)

Minister: Let us remember before God, and commend to his sure keeping: those who have died for their country in war; those whom we knew, and whose memory we treasure; and all who have lived and died in the service of others.

Placing of the remembrance Wreath

(The wreath is brought forward and placed at the altar, after which there will be two minutes silence observed)

To conclude the silence

Minister: They shall grow not old as we that are left grow old;

age shall not weary them nor the years condemn; At the going down of the sun and in the morning

we will remember them

All: We will remember them.

cannot be parted, either by death or life: Hear our prayers and thanksgivings for those whom we remember this day; fulfill in them the purpose of your love; and bring us, with them, to your eternal joy; through Jesus Christ our Lord

Act of Commitment (all standing)

Minister: Let us pledge ourselves anew to the service of God and

others: that we may help, encourage and comfort others, and support those working for the relief of the needy and for

the peace and welfare of the nations.

All: Lord God our Father,

we pledge ourselves to serve you and others,

in the cause of peace,

for the relief of want and suffering,

and for the praise of your name.

Guide us by your Spirit;

Give us wisdom; give us courage; give us hope;

And keep us faithful now and always, Amen.
