Second Sunday in Advent - Christingle

Verse of Scripture - Luke Chapter 3

'Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him.'

Collect Prayer - Before we read we pray

O Lord, raise up we pray, your power and come among us, and with great might succour us; that whereas, through our sins and wickedness we are grievously hindered in running the race that is set before us, your bountiful grace and mercy may speedily help and deliver us; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord., to whom with you and the Holy Spirit, be honour and glory, now and for ever. Amen. *Common Worship*

First Bible Reading - Malachi Chapter 3:1-4

"See, I will send my messenger, who will prepare the way before me. Then suddenly the Lord you are seeking will come to his temple; the messenger of the covenant, whom you desire, will come," says the LORD Almighty. But who can endure the day of his coming? Who can stand when he appears? For he will be like a refiner's fire or a launderer's soap. He will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver; he will purify the Levites and refine them like gold and silver. Then the LORD will have men who will bring offerings in righteousness, and the offerings of Judah and Jerusalem will be acceptable to the LORD, as in days gone by, as in former years.

(Reader: This is the word of the Lord. **All: Thanks be to God**)

Second Reading - Philippians Chapter 1:3-11

I thank my God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus. It is right for me to feel this way about all of you, since I have you in my heart; for whether I am in chains or defending and confirming the gospel, all of you share in God's grace with me. God can testify how I long for all of you with the affection of Christ Jesus. And this is my prayer: that your love may abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight, so that you may be able to discern what is best and may be pure and blameless until the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ--to the glory and praise of God.

(This is the word of the Lord - **All: Thanks be to God**)

Third Reading - Luke Chapter 3:1-6

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar--when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of Iturea and Traconitis, and Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene--during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the desert. He went into all the country around the Jordan, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. As is written in the book of the words of Isaiah the prophet: "A voice of one calling in the desert, 'Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him. Every valley shall be filled in, every mountain and hill made low. The crooked roads shall become straight, the rough ways smooth. And all mankind will see God's salvation.'"

(Reader : This is the word of the Lord. **All: Thanks be to God**)

Commentary

John, son of Zechariah, was a powerful and charismatic figure. His preaching of the gospel of repentance, followed by cleansing in a river, had made him famous over the whole region. Followers flocked to hear his hard-line preaching on the destructive nature of sin and the need for spiritual renewal. All the writers of the Gospels mention John the baptiser and strive to make clear his deference to Jesus. There were many at the time who thought that it might be John who was the Messiah, not his cousin Jesus of Nazareth. John, by quoting the prophet Isaiah, was placing himself in a supporting role to Jesus. He was the last in the succession of prophets to foretell the coming of Jesus. John was happy to be a prophet among prophets and to help his generation understand the significance of the coming of the Lord. John is of great help to us as we think about the coming of the Lord at Christmas. He emphasises the need for examination of the soul, of purification and repentance. The prophet Malachi (the name is a pen-name, meaning “the messenger”) foretells the coming of John the Baptist as one who makes straight the way for the greater One who is to follow, again reminding us that spiritual preparation is not to be ignored or passed over. In the verse from Luke’s gospel we get the image of the voice crying in the wilderness, or desert, a place of barrenness and desolation. This is a vivid image of a world without love and faith. Into that cruel emptiness comes the light of Jesus. But we must prepare our hearts and minds for his Coming. Joan Crossley

Meditation

How can **we** prepare spiritually for the coming of the Lord at Christmas? You will be glad, but not surprised, to know that I am not suggesting anything too rigorous. Where our ancestors would have fasted and attended services of penitence, we just sing carols and cook and shop in the run-up to Christmas. But we could do worse. The hymns of Advent are wonderful prayers in themselves and we can use them in our personal devotions. In my sermon this morning I shall be studying “Oh come, oh come Immanuel”. We could also usefully turn to another Advent hymn “Come thou long expected Jesus”. Charles Wesley with typical economy of words (notice the short lines and crisp poetry) sums up in a very few words the significance of the coming of Jesus, the liberator, the comforter, the deliverer. The hymn is a great invitation to the Lord to enter our hearts and minds. We can make that space ready in our hearts, in our lives and pray for Jesus to come to us.

Prayers for Sunday and the week ahead

Lord Jesus Christ, make me a gossip of the gospel. Help me to share good news with those who are low-spirited, to speak words of comfort to those who are broken hearted, to give hope of freedom to those who are oppressed and to remind those who despair in our world that you have come into it, so that through your love, the world might be saved. May my words and actions help to convince others that they are loved by you, for your sake, Amen (Pauline Webb, “Called to Prayer” Methodist Publishing House 2001)

Second Candle - Jesus the Prince of Peace

The prophets who foretold the birth of Jesus

Leader: Light and peace, in Jesus Christ our Lord

All Thanks be to God

Leader: Today is the Second Sunday of Advent, we remind ourselves of our Saviour Jesus, the Prince of Peace. Last Sunday we lit the first candle in our Advent Wreath, and celebrated the promises spoken in the Old Testament of one who would be born a king in the line of King David. *(A person now lights the first candle, Jesus Son of David)*

Today, as we light the second candle of Advent, we remember Jesus the Prince of Peace. Isaiah the prophet spoke of one who would come, a king in the line of King David. "the Prince of Peace".

Scripture Isaiah 9:6

For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the increase of his government and peace there will be no end. He will reign on David's throne and over his kingdom, establishing and upholding it with justice and righteousness from that time on and forever. The zeal of the LORD Almighty will accomplish this.

Commentary

When Jesus came he taught people the importance of being peacemakers. He said that those who make peace shall be called the children of God. When Christ comes to us he brings us peace and he will bring everlasting peace when he comes again in glory.

(A person now lights the second candle, Jesus the Prince of Peace)

As we light this candle we remind ourselves that only through Jesus is true peace found.

Leader: Jesus is the Prince

All: Jesus the name high over all

Leader: Let us pray

All: Lord Jesus, Light of the World, the prophets said you would bring peace and save your people from trouble. Give peace in our hearts at Christmastide. We ask that as we wait for you to come again, that you would remain present with us. Help us today, and everyday to worship you, to hear your word, and to do your will by sharing your peace with each other. We ask this prayer in the name of Jesus, the name above all names. Amen.

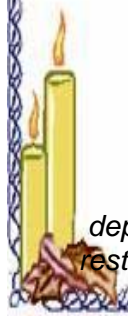
