Methodist Worship

First Reading – Genesis 50:15-21 ‘Joseph forgives his brothers’

When Joseph's brothers saw that their father was dead, they said, "What if Joseph holds a grudge against us and pays us back for all the wrongs we did to him?" So they sent word to Joseph, saying, "Your father left these instructions before he died: 'This is what you are to say to Joseph: I ask you to forgive your brothers the sins and the wrongs they committed in treating you so badly.' Now please forgive the sins of the servants of the God of your father." When their message came to him, Joseph wept.

His brothers then came and threw themselves down before him. "We are your slaves," they said. But Joseph said to them, "Don't be afraid. Am I in the place of God? You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many lives. So then, don't be afraid. I will provide for you and your children." And he reassured them and spoke kindly to them. Joseph stayed in Egypt, along with all his father's family. He lived a hundred and ten years
(Reader: This is the word of the Lord -- **Thanks be to God**)

Second Reading - Romans 14: 1-12

Accept him whose faith is weak, without passing judgment on disputable matters. One man's faith allows him to eat everything, but another man, whose faith is weak, eats only vegetables. The man who eats everything must not look down on him who does not, and the man who does not eat everything must not condemn the man who does, for God has accepted him. Who are you to judge someone else's servant? To his own master he stands or falls. And he will stand, for the Lord is able to make him stand. One man considers one day more sacred than another; another man considers every day alike. Each one should be fully convinced in his own mind. He who regards one day as special, does so to the Lord. He who eats meat, eats to the Lord, for he gives thanks to God; and he who abstains, does so to the Lord and gives thanks to God. For none of us lives to himself alone and none of us dies to himself alone. If we live, we live to the Lord; and if we die, we die to the Lord. So, whether we live or die, we belong to the Lord. For this very reason, Christ died and returned to life so that he might be the Lord of both the dead and the living. You, then, why do you judge your brother? Or why do you look down on your brother? For we will all stand before God's judgment seat. It is written: "'As surely as I live,' says the Lord, 'every knee will bow before me; every tongue will confess to God.'" So then, each of us will give an account of himself to God.
(Reader: This is the word of the Lord -- **Thanks be to God**)

Third Reading - Mathew 18:21-35

Then Peter came to Jesus and asked, "Lord, how many times shall I forgive my brother when he sins against me? Up to seven times?" Jesus answered, "I tell you, not seven times, but seventy-seven times. "Therefore, the kingdom of heaven is like a king who wanted to settle accounts with his servants. As he began the settlement, a man who owed him ten thousand talents was brought to him. Since he was not able to pay, the master ordered that he and his wife and his children and all that he had be sold to repay the debt. "The servant fell on his knees before him. 'Be patient with



me,' he begged, 'and I will pay back everything.' The servant's master took pity on him, cancelled the debt and let him go. "But when that servant went out, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a hundred denarii. He grabbed him and began to choke him. 'Pay back what you owe me!' he demanded.

"His fellow servant fell to his knees and begged him, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay you back.' "But he refused. Instead, he went off and had the man thrown into prison until he could pay the debt. When the other servants saw what had happened, they were greatly distressed and went and told their master everything that had happened. "Then the master called the servant in. 'You wicked servant,' he said, 'I cancelled all that debt of yours because you begged me to. Shouldn't you have had mercy on your fellow servant just as I had on you?' In anger his master turned him over to the jailers to be tortured, until he should pay back all he owed. "This is how my heavenly Father will treat each of you unless you forgive your brother from your heart."

(Reader: This is the word of the Lord - **Thanks be to God**)

Commentary Matthew 18:21-35

Peter asks a question we may all have considered asking at some point in our lives: "Lord, how many times shall I forgive my brother when he sins against me?" He then adds the question, "Up to seven times?" Jesus reply, "I tell you, not seven times, but seventy-seven times." suggests to us that forgiveness is unlimited. As this conversation begins, it suggests that the subject concerns the unlimited nature of forgiveness. Jesus then tells the story of the unforgiving servant. The lord hears his servant's plea for mercy and releases him from this enormous debt. Ten thousand talents would be the equivalent today of millions of pounds and by comparison, the income that Herod received in a year from the whole of Palestine, was in the region of 900 talents. The servant then goes out and condemns his fellow servant, who owes him a few denarii, a paltry debt by comparison, and has him thrown into jail. So we find the story changes in emphasis from being about forgiveness, to be about a person who, having been forgiven himself is in turn unwilling to forgive his brother.

The story moves on, when the fellow servants report the unforgiving servant to their master, who then revokes his act of mercy and condemns him to jail and torture. The story has moved on to be about judgement being brought upon the unmerciful. In the parable there is a final commentary that God will respond in the same way with us if we do not show mercy to our neighbour.

We are not to be troubled with the number of times we forgive another. The Teachers of the Law would have had great debates over the number of times that we should forgive, but that is not our concern. At the heart is the message that we should forgive our neighbour in the same manner in which we have been forgiven ourselves. God is supremely generous in His mercy towards us and so likewise, we should forgive those who have wronged us. There is also the warning, that we face a judgement about those times when we are unforgiving, when we are unwilling to let go of the hurt we have incurred. There will be a time of reckoning. Are we ready to give an account of our lack of mercy in the face of God's generosity to us? Finally, the message from this parable is quite clear, as we have been forgiven, so we should forgive our neighbour.

Meditation 'Forgiveness is giving up hope of a better past'

Jesus tells us today that we should forgive, in an unlimited way. The offence, or the person who commits it is not the question, rather the condition of our souls. If we do not forgive then our lives become twisted and damaging to ourselves and others. It is only as we learn to forgive that we let go of destructive anger. If we are loving beings then our souls are in good shape, however a lack of forgiveness can make us angry and full of hatred and desire for revenge. Whilst we may desire to see wickedness punished, nevertheless if we are personally unforgiving then we only punish ourselves. Lack of forgiveness damages us, not the person with whom we have the grievance. Christians are encouraged to let go of anger and forgive, no matter how legitimate our anger really is. In doing this we are not turning a blind eye to evil, which may or may not be discovered and prosecuted, rather we are allowing ourselves to be healed and in letting go we enable ourselves to live free of the past hurts. Forgiveness is not just something we do for others it is something we do for ourselves to enable us to live free of the past.

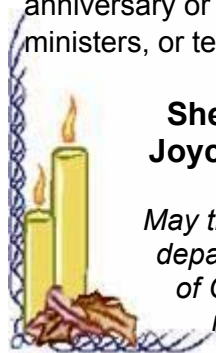
