The desert and the parched land will be glad; the wilderness will rejoice and blossom. Like the crocus, it will burst into bloom; it will rejoice greatly and shout for joy. The glory of Lebanon will be given to it, the splendour of Carmel and Sharon; they will see the glory of the LORD, the splendour of our God. I have been actively involved at Anjulita Court, the MHA residential/care home in Bedford, for 9 months now and I can honestly say that it has been a privilege to share in this journey with so many beautiful people, both members of staff and residents as well as relatives and volunteers.

The set readings help us to explore the theme in a number of ways, from the preparation to set off (Luke) the importance of what we take compared to where we go (Philippians) to the promise of the destination God has prepared for us (Isaiah).

How many of us have spent time preparing for a holiday, for moving home or planning what is needed for a term at university? It often seems like the smallest person needs the most luggage, especially in the case of all the 'paraphernalia' required for taking a baby even the shortest distance! On life's journey we pick up so much, experiences and insights that benefit ourselves and others but also many items of 'baggage', those things that simply weigh us down and need leaving behind. As we get older there is more and more we carry, both material belongings and experiences, but unfortunately our society seems to value the material while neglecting the wisdom that our elders have to share with us. According to the Philippians reading even the best of what we have gained is nothing beside the beauty of life in Christ. This is not to say that all we have done to date, all our gifts and skills etc... are worthless, it is rather that the very best of what we know or can even dream of doesn't come close to what God has prepared for us.

This Lent I was able to share in a study group at Anjulita Court, involving both residents and a couple of relatives. Lent is a journey in its own right and the new insights I gained from sharing with those who have recently given up everything - home and belongings, friends and social routine - to enable the latter stages of their pilgrimage to be easier have been deep and powerful. The grace shown by some is incredible, while the inner turmoil for some is the point at which we meet, for example how do we focus on the positive of having moved there to 'live life to the full' when it is also true that they have moved there to die?

God made each one of us, and we are perfect in his sight. Some questions do not have easy answers, and it is right that this should be so. Our task is to travel the road with each other, to share our experiences, to be prepared to learn from each other, to be ready to carry others burdens for a while and to have the grace to let others do the same for us.

If you would like to get involved in life at Anjulita Court there is now a regular programme of activities provided for residents, so there are opportunities for most gift to be shared, from group performances to one-to-one contact with residents. The Coffee Shop is also now open 10am - 3pm Monday to Friday, and we have a Fete on July 3rd, so feel free to drop in. Yours in faith, Jane

Joint statement from Cumbria church leaders on the shootings that took place in West Cumbria on Wednesday 2 June 2010

Our thoughts and prayers are with all those who have been caught up in the terrible events of yesterday, but particularly they are with the family and friends of those who have been killed or injured. The community grieves deeply at the losses we have suffered; the confusion and pain will be long-lasting.

We are all grateful for the dedication of all those members of the emergency services who have worked tirelessly to help the injured and to bring the situation to a conclusion. We also pay tribute to the members of the public who did what they could to help other people, perhaps total strangers, who had been wounded.

All the churches from across a very wide area have been, and will continue to be, involved in supporting those affected by yesterday's tragedy. In addition to ministering to people in our communities, clergy will be available to support the hospital and emergency services chaplains as required. The church will continue to play a longer term role in providing support and sanctuary to those who need it, and we strongly encourage all churches in the area to make their buildings and people available for people to come and pray, light candles and have someone to talk to.

The communities of West Cumbria are close-knit and hugely supportive, and we know that people throughout the area will be caring deeply for each other both now and in the months to come. Christians in Cumbria and further afield are praying for everyone who has been affected, and are doing everything they can to offer comfort and practical

help at a local level.
