First Bible Reading – Zephaniah 3:14-20

Sing, O Daughter of Zion; shout aloud, O Israel! Be glad and rejoice with all your heart, O Daughter of Jerusalem! The LORD has taken away your punishment, he has turned back your enemy. The LORD, the King of Israel, is with you; never again will you fear any harm. On that day they will say to Jerusalem, "Do not fear, O Zion; do not let your hands hang limp. The LORD your God is with you, he is mighty to save. He will take great delight in you, he will quiet you with his love, he will rejoice over you with singing." "The sorrows for the appointed feasts I will remove from you; they are a burden and a reproach to you. At that time I will deal with all who oppressed you; I will rescue the lame and gather those who have been scattered. I will give them praise and honour in every land where they were put to shame. At that time I will gather you; at that time I will bring you home. I will give you honour and praise among all the peoples of the earth when I restore your fortunes before your very eyes," says the LORD

Second Bible Reading - Philippians 4:4-7

Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

(This is the word of the Lord **All: Thanks be to God**)

Gospel Reading - Luke 3: 7-18 When announced **All:–Glory to Christ our Saviour**

John said to the crowds coming out to be baptized by him, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath? Produce fruit in keeping with repentance. And do not begin to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father.' For I tell you that out of these stones God can raise up children for Abraham. The axe is already at the root of the trees, and every tree that does not produce good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire." "What should we do then?" the crowd asked. John answered, "The man with two tunics should share with him who has none, and the one who has food should do the same." Tax collectors also came to be baptized. "Teacher," they asked, "what should we do?" "Don't collect any more than you are required to," he told them.

Then some soldiers asked him, "And what should we do?" He replied, "Don't extort money and don't accuse people falsely--be content with your pay." The people were waiting expectantly and were all wondering in their hearts if John might possibly be the Christ. John answered them all, "I baptize you with water. But one more powerful than I will come, the thongs of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but he will burn up the chaff with unquenchable fire." And with many other words John exhorted the people and preached the good news to them. (This is the Gospel of Christ **All: Praise to Christ our Lord**)

Commentary Gaudete Sunday

This reading from Philippians is the traditional one for the third Sunday of Advent and gave it the name by which this Sunday is sometimes known, "Gaudete Sunday." Despite the tradition of using same liturgical colour of purple as is used for Lent, Advent is not a gloomy season (although John the Baptist does preach repentance in our Gospel reading!). Advent is marked by its finale of Christmas where, as the Lord comes nearer and nearer, we become more and more excited. The rhythm of Advent is well captured by the Advent wreath, which starts with one lighted candle and ends with four, the pink candle often being lit today. Gaudete Sunday, 'Rejoice Sunday', provides the central theme of the readings for this particular Sunday in Advent. This year the Third Sunday is a mere nine days before the celebration of the birth of Christ and the sense of joyful anticipation is emphasized. Jesus, as Victorious Messiah, is drawing near.

The first two chapters from the book of Zephaniah are full of prophecies against the nation, the leaders and the people of Israel. Disasters will befall God's people because of their false worship and disregard for the needs of the poor. The very first verses of the book declare that God is going to sweep away all living things from the face of the earth. The leaders, the judges, the prophets, and the priests have all defiled the nation and the city of Jerusalem and consequences should follow. But then we read that the Lord Himself will save His people and bring them home. There will be a salvation. The dark times of the past have been driven away and a time of rejoicing has arrived.

John the Baptist's preaching, which in some ways parallels the message of Zephaniah, predicts the imminent arrival of the Messiah, and demands a response from all who hear it. Many different people respond by asking what is required from them. In front of John a diverse variety of people line up to find out what they must do to be ready. They want to know what's going to be expected that will make them ready for this soon to be happening event. The crowds, the tax collectors, the soldiers and presumably other groups of influential people, stepped up to make sure they would be wearing the proper clothes and appearing just right and ready. But John the Baptist tells each in turn to let go of the natural inclinations of their trade or lifestyle. They need to let go of the things that provide them with their supposed security and perceived freedom so they can be truly secure and free.

Luke ends this passage with John continuing to distribute the "Good News." The rejoicing, it seem, is both in the giving and the receiving of the news of the coming of the presence of the Good. Rejoicing which will be echoed in the giving and receiving of gifts this Christmas. Gifts which express something about the giver, the receiver and something about the relationship between both. As such they are also an echo of the three fold relationships implicit in the Trinity. As we share communion together we have the same sense of giving, receiving and of rejoicing. Our actions in receiving communion have words which make explicit what is being said by the gift which is offered, the sacraments we receive and share and the presence of God which they represent in our lives. Similarly, as we celebrate Christmas we express something about our feelings and our reverence for the God who became incarnate and of respond in some small way to His love for us. John was preparing to present Jesus and made it explicit by his preaching. Like Zechariah John is proclaiming that the time of falsehood is coming to an end. Like Zechariah, this is no abstract concept but a breaking through of a God who will become incarnate in a personal form to liberate His people. He will bring them to their true home, not some geographic piece of land (although John does baptise in the river Jordan where the Israelites came into the Promised Land) but a home which is spiritual in its locus and purpose, eternal in its nature and one which will never fade or be invaded or overrun by foreign armies and enemies. A

place of real security and truth. A place called home. God invites each one of us to that same land, a place of security and warmth, filled with His everlasting and unfathomable love. He invites us home. Wherever we have been, wherever we may have travelled in the past, He calls to us as John the Baptist called to his followers. He invites us to respond, as did the followers of John, as The God who became incarnate at Christmas and became homeless for us welcomes us back to His home and invites us in to stay for ever.

Meditation

Zephaniah is a mysterious book. Despite placing itself in the days of King Josiah, 640 – 609 BC, around the same time as Jeremiah, there is considerable debate about its structure, how it was written, and about the date of the book itself. Overall it speaks of God's judgement and ultimately His promise to restore the faithful few. But there's an interesting twist half way through today's reading where, following some verses speaking to the readers in the third person and announcing to them that the Lord has taken away their punishment and is with them, the passage then switches to the Lord Himself speaking in the first person and promising to gather His people and to bring them home, to give them honour and praise and to restore their fortunes. Is this home Jerusalem? Perhaps so, but it's clear that home is not so much a place or location, or 'where the heart is', but home is where God is, wherever that may be. It could be Jerusalem, but only if God is there too. Jane Williams reminds us that it was Augustine who wrote, 'Our hearts are restless till they find their rest in thee'. Sometimes everyone's hearts can be restless and looking for a home. It is God's willingness to be homeless in order that he might bring everyone home that we celebrate at Christmas, and we prepare ourselves for that life changing time with anticipation in Advent.

Prayers for Sunday and the Week ahead

O God, whose son Jesus Christ our Lord showed the world His majesty and His humility, keep us ever focused on you so that when we are tempted to show our own majesty we are instead stirred to demonstrate our humility; so that the glory of He whom we represent can be shown in all the world. Amen

God for whom we wait and watch, you sent your servant John the Baptist to prepare your people for the coming of the Messiah. Inspire the ministers and stewards of your truth to turn our disobedient hearts to you; that, when Christ shall come again in glory to be our judge, we may stand with confidence before him, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, world without end. Amen

Grant. O God, that as we rejoice in the hope of the coming of our Saviour, we may seek to prepare the way of His coming by advancing His Kingdom in the world and caring for the needs of our fellow men and women, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen
