# First Sunday of Lent

## First Bible Reading - Genesis 7:1-7, 15-16

When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the LORD appeared to him and said, "I am God Almighty ; walk before me and be blameless. I will confirm my covenant between me and you and will greatly increase your numbers." Abram fell facedown, and God said to him, "As for me, this is my covenant with you: You will be the father of many nations. No longer will you be called Abram ; your name will be Abraham, for I have made you a father of many nations. I will make you very fruitful; I will make nations of you, and kings will come from you. I will establish my covenant as an everlasting covenant between me and you and your descendants after you for the generations to come, to be your God and the God of your descendants after you. God also said to Abraham, "As for Sarai your wife, you are no longer to call her Sarai; her name will be Sarah. I will bless her and will surely give you a son by her. I will bless her so that she will be the mother of nations; kings of peoples will come from her."  
(This is the word of the Lord—**Thanks be to God**)

## Second Bible Reading - Romans 4:13-25

It was not through law that Abraham and his offspring received the promise that he would be heir of the world, but through the righteousness that comes by faith. For if those who live by law are heirs, faith has no value and the promise is worthless, because law brings wrath. And where there is no law there is no transgression. Therefore, the promise comes by faith, so that it may be by grace and may be guaranteed to all Abraham's offspring—not only to those who are of the law but also to those who are of the faith of Abraham. He is the father of us all. As it is written: "I have made you a father of many nations." He is our father in the sight of God, in whom he believed--the God who gives life to the dead and calls things that are not as though they were. Against all hope, Abraham in hope believed and so became the father of many nations, just as it had been said to him, "So shall your offspring be." Without weakening in his faith, he faced the fact that his body was as good as dead--since he was about a hundred years old--and that Sarah's womb was also dead. Yet he did not waver through unbelief regarding the promise of God, but was strengthened in his faith and gave glory to God, being fully persuaded that God had power to do what he had promised. This is why "it was credited to him as righteousness."



The words "it was credited to him" were written not for him alone, but also for us, to whom God will credit righteousness--for us who believe in him who raised Jesus our Lord from the dead. He was delivered over to death for our sins and was raised to life for our justification. (This is the word of the Lord – **Thanks be to God**)

### **Gospel Reading - Mark 8:31-38**

He then began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, chief priests and teachers of the law, and that he must be killed and after three days rise again. He spoke plainly about this, and Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him.

But when Jesus turned and looked at his disciples, he rebuked Peter. "Get behind me, Satan!" he said. "You do not have in mind the things of God, but the things of men." Then he called the crowd to him along with his disciples and said: "If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. For whoever wants to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for me and for the gospel will save it.

What good is it for a man to gain the whole world, yet forfeit his soul? Or what can a man give in exchange for his soul? If anyone is ashamed of me and my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, the Son of Man will be ashamed of him when he comes in his Father's glory with the holy angels." (This is the word of the Lord – **Thanks be to God**)

### **Post Communion Prayer**

Almighty God, you see that we have no power of ourselves to help ourselves: keep us outwardly in our bodies, and inwardly in our souls; that we may be defended from all adversities which may happen to the body and from all evil thoughts which may assault and hurt the soul; through Christ our Lord. Amen.

### **Commentary**

In the passage from Mark today we find Jesus with his disciples in Caesarea Philippi. It is at this great seat of human power that Jesus takes stock of himself and he asks the disciples who other people and who they think he is. Peter answers that Jesus is the Messiah (*Greek = Christ*). Jesus prefers to use a title about himself which lacks such overtones of kingship and military power. Jesus speaks of himself as 'Son of Man' and defines this title in terms of rejection, suffering and ultimate death.

It is a horrible twist on the prevailing thought of the day which predicted that God would send a Messiah to liberate the Jewish people from the Roman occupation. For the disciples it meant an incredibly disappointing turn of events as they had assumed that they would be a part of the glorious new kingdom which Jesus was about to establish. No wonder that Peter gets above himself and rebukes Jesus - the one he has just declared to be Christ ! Poor Peter must have been beside himself with disappointment that the one who promised so much now had such a low opinion of himself that he was going to offer himself up for death on a cross. The cross was the death reserved for the really undeserving criminals. Jesus is about as firm as he could possibly be in his response to Peter, in fact he see the words used to dissuade him from his God given task as nothing short of a further temptation by Satan to drive him off course. Peter is not only rebuked but the disciples are told that they too must have such a clarity of vision and purpose that they will follow Jesus along this path of suffering and rejection.

There is a temptation to see a whiff here of that religion which has been seen all around the world from the earliest times, that God is in need of placating by our suffering and death. In many cultures there is a desire to appease god with offerings of sacrifices of anything from animals to virgins. Across the faiths worshippers are seen to whip themselves, deny themselves and equally punish those considered to be ungodly with all manner of torture and torment.

However Jesus is not calling his disciples to a life of asceticism in which they must wear coarse shirts and be uncomfortable at all cost. Albeit such ideas sit well with the denials of Lent ! Rather Jesus is about setting aside our interests to discover God's interests. Refusing to go down any other path or direction than the one which God has set for us in a daily act of committal.

Jesus is of course calling his followers to a life of real fulfillment rather than the illusory fulfilment which in reality brings only pain and suffering. Listen to the prescription which Jesus gives, 'whoever loses his life will save it'. Jim Elliot, a missionary who was murdered on the mission field by the Auca Indians as he

tried to minister to them, earlier assessed the risk saying: "He is no fool who gives what he cannot keep to gain what he cannot lose." What he meant was that in service is found freedom. Those who pursue gain from a human perspective will find it to be an empty promise. Earthly wealth and treasure is no treasure at all, so it is entirely sensible to throw it overboard so that that the lifeboat can float. *Charles Royden*

## Meditation From Bishop Alan

Following the terrible murders in Paris at the offices of Charlie Hebdo in January, there has been much debate about the importance of freedom of speech. There have even been articles about whether we have a 'right to offend' other people.

Although freedom of speech is limited in every country, it is important that we encourage robust debate, not least with those with whom we disagree. Indeed, it is often through such exchanges that we learn and grow. However, we need to think about how we choose to express ourselves. It is significant that the Universal Declaration of Human Rights begins with a statement which talks both about rights but also the responsibility to treat one another as brothers and sisters:

*'All human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights. They are endowed with reason and conscience and should act towards one another in a spirit of brotherhood.'*

Whilst Charlie Hebdo may have the legal right under French law to mock and humiliate those with whom they disagree, they need to remember that there is also a moral dimension to all relationships. For many of us Charlie Hebdo's response seemed designed to whip up further hatred: an eye for an eye. As Ghandi pointed out, this ultimately results in a world where everyone is blind.

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus taught a different way 'Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me. Rejoice and be glad, because great is your reward in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you (Matt 5. 11-12). As Christians we follow a Saviour who was mocked as he hung on the cross: 'Those who passed by hurled insults at him, shaking their heads (Matt 27.39). St Peter, reflecting on what he had witnessed commented 'When they hurled their insults at him, he did not retaliate; when he suffered, he made no threats. Instead, he entrusted himself to him who judges justly' (1 Peter. 2. 23). He exhorted his fellow Christians when facing opposition 'Do not repay evil with evil or insult with insult. On the contrary, repay evil with blessing, because to this you were called so that you may inherit a blessing.'

As we journey through Lent, the media will be full of debates in the run up to the General Election. The statement 'Who is my Neighbour' recently released by the House of Bishops, calls for a new vision of how we do politics. I hope that one of the things that Christians can contribute is the way that we treat others, especially those with whom we disagree:

A million sold and voted the UK's favourite Fairtrade Egg! The Real Easter Egg, the only easter egg sold with with a copy of the Easter story in each box, has sold a million since it was introduced in 2010.



Initially turned down by supermarkets, as they were unsure that a 'faith egg' would sell, the Real Easter Egg was voted the UK's favourite Fairtrade egg in a national poll last year. How wrong they were. There is also a charitable donation for every 150g egg sold. More than £140,000 has been donated from sales. It also supports farmers and producers in the developing world by using Fairtrade chocolate. David Marshall, who heads up the Meaningful Chocolate Company, said; "The Real Easter Egg campaign aims to establish giving a Real Easter Egg as a tradition. We can be found in Tesco, Waitrose and Morrison's. However, we make very little from

supermarket sales so we do rely on direct sales from churches and schools. Last year we sent more than 400,000 eggs through the post. This is a very positive example of putting our faith into practice so I hope churches will support this year's Real Easter Egg campaign by visiting [www.realeasteregg.co.uk](http://www.realeasteregg.co.uk) and ordering.

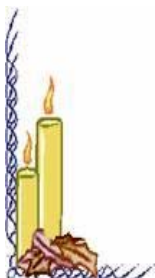
