## First Bible Reading - Jeremiah 31: 27-34

"The days are coming," declares the Lord, "when I will plant the kingdoms of Israel and Judah with the offspring of people and of animals. Just as I watched over them to uproot and tear down, and to overthrow, destroy and bring disaster, so I will watch over them to build and to plant," declares the Lord. "In those days people will no longer say,

'The parents have eaten sour grapes, and the children's teeth are set on edge.'

Instead, everyone will die for their own sin; whoever eats sour grapes—their own teeth will be set on edge. "The days are coming," declares the Lord, "when I will make a new covenant with the people of Israel and with the people of Judah. It will not be like the covenant I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to lead them out of Egypt, because they broke my covenant, though I was a husband to them," declares the Lord.

"This is the covenant I will make with the people of Israel after that time," declares the Lord.

"I will put my law in their minds and write it on their hearts.

I will be their God, and they will be my people. No longer will they teach their neighbour, or say to one another, 'Know the Lord,' because they will all know me, from the least of them to the greatest," declares the Lord. "For I will forgive their wickedness and will remember their sins no more."

(This is the word of the Lord — **Thanks be to God**)

## Second Reading - 2 Timothy 3:14- 4:5

But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have become convinced of, because you know those from whom you learned it, and how from infancy you have known the holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.

In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who will judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing and his kingdom, I give you this charge: Preach the Word; be prepared in season and out of season; correct, rebuke and encourage—with great patience and careful instruction. For the time will come when men will not put up with sound doctrine. Instead, to suit their own desires, they will gather around them a great number of teachers to say what their itching ears want to hear.

They will turn their ears away from the truth and turn aside to myths. But you, keep your head in all situations, endure hardship, do the work of an evangelist, discharge all the duties of your ministry.

(This is the word of the Lord — **Thanks be to God**)

## Gospel Reading – Luke 18:1-8

(Please stand When the reading is announced '**Glory to Christ our Saviour**')

Then Jesus told his disciples a parable to show them that they should always pray and not give up. He said: "In a certain town there was a judge who neither feared God nor cared about men. And there was a widow in that town who kept coming to him with the plea, 'Grant me justice against my adversary.' "For some time he refused. But finally he said to himself, 'Even though I don't fear God or care about men, yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will see that she gets justice, so that she won't eventually wear me out with her coming!' " And the Lord said, "Listen to what the unjust judge says. And will not God bring about justice for his chosen ones, who cry out to him day

and night? Will he keep putting them off? I tell you, he will see that they get justice, and quickly. However, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on the earth?"

(This is the Gospel of Christ — **'Praise to Christ our Lord'**)

### **Commentary**

The gospel reading is the story of the persistent widow and has echoes of the story of the friend who came at midnight (Luke 11v5-8). Both are used by Luke to emphasise the need to pray seriously, but both are more than that. The central character in today's story is the judge— who neither feared God nor cared about men— but who did give justice to the widow who kept on at him! If the judge does that how much more certain is it that God will listen to the cry of the poor. He is moved to compassion ; he is compassion! Jesus is saying in these two parables that God will deliver the disciples from coming opposition and tribulation. We can trust God absolutely : nothing is more certain than his mercy for his own. Yes— how much more will God come to the aid of those who believe. As the song goes “ The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases. His mercies never come to an end. They are new every morning: Great is thy faithfulness, O Lord.”

The parable contrasted God and the judge. But some people see God himself as a stern judge who dispenses justice (punishments) if we break the rules. At the other extreme are those who see God as a sort of indulgent, favourite uncle—a soft touch— who says 'never mind' and always lets us off. In between is the picture of God that Jesus gives us as a loving, compassionate father—the good shepherd who lays down his life for his sheep. Yes, Jesus died for love of us. And this has led to some debate recently when a Christian denomination in the USA (Congregational , I believe) was bringing out a new hymn book. They wanted to include the Stuart Townend & Keith Getty song “In Christ alone,” which has the lines in it “till on the cross as Jesus died the wrath of God was satisfied— They asked to change it to “till on the cross as Jesus died the love of God was glorified”. Permission was refused. I find the decision disturbing and sad. John tells us “God is love”. And in John's gospel we read “God so loved the world that he gave his only son so that whoever believes in him will not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his son into the world to be it's judge, but to be it's Saviour.” (John 3 v16-17) So love is stressed again—that is steadfast, dependable, and “knows neither measure nor end” as we sing in a hymn today. So how can God send Jesus to die to appease his own wrath - if he is love? Adrian Plass, the humorous Christian writer summed up his thoughts on the topic like this. “God is nice and he likes me. I want people to know that God loves them so that they can serve him with a glad heart. God must be at least as nice as my mother— perhaps even a little nicer— and his grace inhabits that wonderfully mellow country that lies between the craggy rocks of being told off and the deceptive swamps of being let off. You might like to read Luke 23v39-43. Was the dying thief penitent? Did he deserve paradise? Do we ever deserve God's grace? Finally, Jeremiah 31. A wonderful chapter! A gospel before the Gospel almost. Words like “ I have loved you with an everlasting love”, “He will watch over his flock like a shepherd”, “ I will make a new covenant”, “I will write my love on their hearts”. And then “I will forgive their wickedness and will remember their sins no more”. Yes—with God – the slate is wiped clean. What a promise of Good News! Our generous God is always taking initiatives of love. *Richard Ledger*

**A new course material suitable for home groups has been prepared called Pilgrim**, which is being promoted as "a course for the Christian journey." 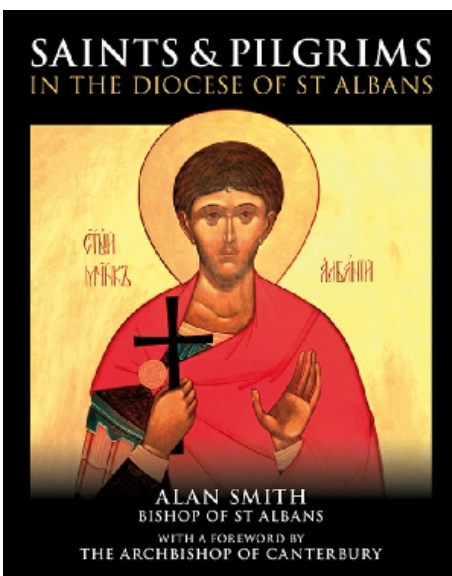
