Bible Notes - Trinity Sunday (Trinity Sunday Year A)

Verse of Scripture Isaiah Chapter 40:28

Do you not know? Have you not heard? The LORD is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He will not grow tired or weary, and his understanding no one can fathom. He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak. Even youths grow tired and weary, and young men stumble and fall; but those who hope in the LORD will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint.

A Collect Prayer - Before we read we pray

Father God, you have created all things and through Christ revealed your salvation in all the world. Give us a vision of your glory and by your Holy Spirit fill us with life and love that we may praise and serve you through Jesus Christ our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen**

First Reading -Genesis 1:2 - 2: 4a

In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. Now the earth was formless and empty. darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters. And God said, "Let there be light," and there was light. God saw that the light was good, and he separated the light from the darkness. God called the light "day," and the darkness he called "night." And there was evening, and there was morning--the first day. And God said, "Let there be an expanse between the waters to separate water from water." So God made the expanse and separated the water under the expanse from the water above it. And it was so. God called the expanse "sky." And there was evening, and there was morning--the second day. And God said, "Let the water under the sky be gathered to one place, and let dry ground appear." And it was so. God called the dry ground "land," and the gathered waters he called "seas." And God saw that it was good. Then God said, "Let the land produce vegetation: seed-bearing plants and trees on the land that bear fruit with seed in it, according to their various kinds." And it was so. The land produced vegetation: plants bearing seed according to their kinds and trees bearing fruit with seed in it according to their kinds. And God saw that it was good. And there was evening, and there was morning--the third day And God said, "Let there be lights in the expanse of the sky to separate the day from the night, and let them serve as signs to mark seasons and days and years, and let them be lights in the expanse of the sky to give light on the earth." And it was so. God made two great lights--the greater light to govern the day and the lesser light to govern the night. He also made the stars. God set them in the expanse of the sky to give light on the earth, to govern the day and the night, and to separate light from darkness. And God saw that it was good. And there was evening, and there was morning--the fourth day. And God said, "Let the water teem with living creatures, and let birds fly above the earth across the expanse of the sky." So God created the great creatures of the sea and every living and moving thing with which the water teems, according to their kinds, and every winged bird according to its kind. And God saw that it was good. God blessed them and said, "Be fruitful and increase in number and fill the water in the seas, and let the birds increase on the earth." And there was evening, and there was morning--the fifth day. And God said, "Let the land produce living creatures according to their kinds: livestock, creatures that move along the ground, and wild animals, each according to its kind." And it was so. Thus the heavens and the earth were completed in all their vast array. By the seventh day God had finished the work he had been doing; so on the seventh day he rested from all his work. And God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, because on it he rested from all the work of creating that he had done. This is the account of the heavens and the earth when they were created.

Second Reading - 2 Corinthians 13: 11-13

Finally, brothers, good-by. Aim for perfection, listen to my appeal, be of one mind, live in peace. And the God of love and peace will be with you. Greet one another with a holy kiss. All the saints

send their greetings. May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

Third Reading - Matthew 28: 16-20

Then the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had told them to go. When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted. Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." (This is the word of the Lord—**Thanks be to God**)

Commentary

"When I first started studying Theology at Westminster College in Oxford, we were taught a course called "God of Creation and Redemption". The course concerned Systematic Theology, which seeks to give a rational and orderly account of the content of Christian belief and ethics. It was a very comprehensive course and covered God's acts of Creation at the beginning of time and His continuing Re-creation through the redemptive work of Jesus Christ and we also explored the work of the Holy Spirit. So the Trinity was an important part of our studies. Looking back on the course now, one criticism I would level at it is that it should have had the words "and Sanctification", in the title, to include the ministry of the Holy Spirit too.

The Gospel passage we read today is extremely important in many ways as it speaks of the Great Commission of Jesus to his disciples, to preach the Gospel to all people and all nations. It is also significant in that it mentions baptism in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. This is an early Trinitarian formula, expressing that God has three aspect or persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, who are different, yet one.

Now it is extremely difficult to explain the Trinity and to put the whole Doctrine of the Trinity into a few words would be to do it a gross injustice. However, the doctrine of the Trinity reminds us that there is more to God than we may initially perceive and that as we may come to know God through Jesus Christ, we may also grow in our understanding of the Father as we journey in Faith and we may also grow in holiness through the Sanctifying work of the Holy Spirit.

Trinitarian thought will continue to baffle and confound, but the Trinity is a central Doctrine of the Christian Faith, expressing God's multifaceted Love and involvement in the whole of Creation." *Neil Bramble Chapman*

Meditation

Bishop Richard Chartres, writing on the Holy Trinity

"You can't have a God. If you have, possess a God, if you talk about My God, my own little possession that helps me, my asset, then what you have is not the true and living God, father of our Lord Jesus Christ, but an Idol, a God made in our own image. And, brothers and sisters, much of the history of religion, even in the Christian Religion, is an attempt to make Gods of ourselves, by launching ego-projections into the middle distance - plop - and then having an affair with that ego-projection. That's what religion has been, so very often."

But it is also scandalous that, after all this time, the rules that govern international trade still trap poor people in poverty.

This is how your donation can make a difference this Christian Aid Week

£66 maintains one girl at the Bridge School in India for a month, giving her a chance of education that otherwise would not be available.

£112 buys a water tank for a Peruvian village. This means that the villagers can get water without having to walk to the nearest stream which could be over 2 km away.
