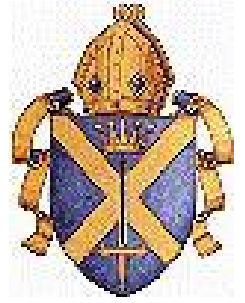

Pentecost

Opening Verse of Scripture -Romans 5:5

The love of God has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us.

Collect Prayer for the Day *Before we read we pray:*

Almighty God, who on the day of Pentecost sent your Holy Spirit on the disciples with the wind from heaven and with tongues of flame, filling them with joy and boldness to preach the Gospel: send us out in the power of the same Spirit to witness to your truth and to draw everyone to the fire of your love, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Methodist Worship

First Reading – Acts 2:1-21

When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them. Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven. When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard them speaking in his own language. Utterly amazed, they asked: "Are not all these men who are speaking Galileans? Then how is it that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene; visitors from Rome (both Jews and converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs--we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!" Amazed and perplexed, they asked one another, "What does this mean?" Some, however, made fun of them and said, "They have had too much wine." Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd: "Fellow Jews and all of you who live in Jerusalem, let me explain this to you; listen carefully to what I say. These men are not drunk, as you suppose. It's only nine in the morning! No, this is what was spoken by the prophet Joel: "In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visions, your old men will dream dreams. Even on my servants, both men and women, I will pour out my Spirit in those days, and they will prophesy. I will show wonders in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood and fire and billows of smoke. The sun will be turned to darkness and the moon to blood before the coming of the great and glorious day of the Lord. And everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.

(Reader: This is the Word of the Lord. **All: Thanks be to God**)

Second Reading – Revelation Chapter 8:14-17

Those who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God. For you did not receive a spirit that makes you a slave again to fear, but you received the Spirit of sonship. And by him we cry, "Abba, Father." The Spirit himself testifies with our spirit that we are God's children. Now if we are children, then we are heirs--heirs of God and co-heirs with Christ, if indeed we share in his sufferings in order that we may also share in his glory.

(Reader: This is the Word of the Lord. **All: Thanks be to God**)

Gospel Reading – John 14:8-17

Philip said, "Lord, show us the Father and that will be enough for us." Jesus answered: "Don't you know me, Philip, even after I have been among you such a long time? Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'?"

Don't you believe that I am in the Father, and that the Father is in me? The words I say to you



are not just my own. Rather, it is the Father, living in me, who is doing his work. Believe me when I say that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; or at least believe on the evidence of the miracles themselves. I tell you the truth, anyone who has faith in me will do what I have been doing. He will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father. And I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Son may bring glory to the Father. You may ask me for anything in my name, and I will do it. "If you love me, you will obey what I command. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Counsellor to be with you forever-- the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you. (Reader: This is the Word of the Lord. **All: Thanks be to God**)

Post Communion Prayer

Faithful God, who fulfilled the promises of Easter by sending us your Holy Spirit and opening to every race and nation the way of life eternal: open our lips by your Spirit, that every tongue may tell of your glory; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Commentary

Our readings are about the Holy Spirit changing people. In Romans 8: 14-17 people become children of God—in a new and intimate relationship with him in which there is no fear. We are not to be afraid of God for, as John says, He is love and perfect love casts out fear.

The gospel reading talks about the Spirit of truth, he will live in us and be with us. Through the Holy Spirit God is with us, through all the changing circumstances of our lives, to guide and strengthen or encourage us. Shades of Psalm 23 here.

Then in Acts 2 we read of the release of God's spirit of love— to empower and transform— to start the amazing story of the worldwide spread of the goodness of God's love in Jesus, our crucified, risen and ascended Lord.

Nature shows that God delights in diversity, and so it is in the Church, the body of Christ. Every Christian is different; each has a special and different contribution to make, and it is by the Holy Spirit that God enables and equips us to serve him in the way (s) that he wants.

We all have different gifts and in the New Testament there are lists of some of the gifts of the Spirit. They range widely! 1 Corinthians 12: 7-11 lists wisdom, knowledge, faith, gifts of healing, miraculous powers, prophesy, distinguishing between spirits, speaking in tongues and interpretation. In verses 28-30 Paul lists gifts to enable people to be apostles, teachers, helpers and administrators; evangelists and pastors (Ephesians 4: 11); serving, encouraging, giving leadership, showing mercy.(Romans 12:7 while 1 Peter:4 includes hospitality and speaking.

All good gifts are from God. The German theologian Jurgen Moltmann points out "In principle every human potentiality and capacity can become a gift of the Spirit through a person's call if they are used in Christ." In Ephesians 4 Paul says that God wants the body of Christ to be built up until we reach unity in the faith... We will in all things grow up into him who is the Head, that is, Christ. From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work. And that can involve us all!

For each of us is unique, each one of us is special to God; each one of us is called to serve Him. There is no suggestion at all that all Christians have, or should have, the same gift (s). That would be as silly as saying that God wants us all to be vicars or organists or Church Treasurers! The mind boggles, and Paul writes against such views in 1 Corinthians 12: 12-26. It is well worth reading.

Christians discover that as God equips them to serve him in different ways, so their lives begin to be changed and these new characteristics that develop in our lives are described by Paul as fruits of the Spirit. He lists them in Galatians 5: 22– love, joy, peace, patience, kindness,

goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self– control.

Nicky Gumbel in his book on the Alpha course says that the most important fruit is love. He says that love is at the heart of the Christian Faith, that the Bible is the story of God's love for us, and that God's greatest desire is that we should respond by loving Him and our neighbour. Without this love, he says (echoing St Paul), everything else counts for nothing. Now there's a thought for us all. *Richard Ledger*

Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast; it is not proud. It is not rude, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. Love never fails.

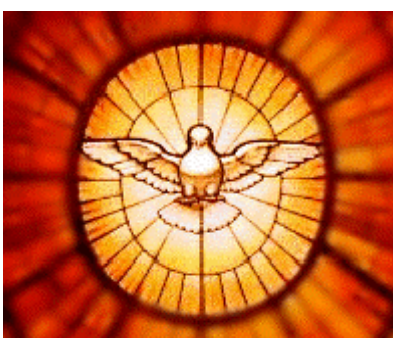
Gracious God

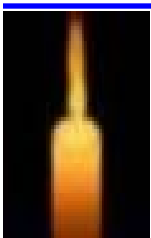
