Second Reading - 2 Corinthians 6:1-13

We have spoken freely to you, Corinthians, and opened wide our hearts to you. We are not withholding our affection from you, but you are withholding yours from us. As a fair exchange--I speak as to my children--open wide your hearts also

Gospel Reading -Mark 4:35-41

That day when evening came, he said to his disciples, "Let us go over to the other side." Leaving the crowd behind, they took him along, just as he was, in the boat. There were also other boats with him. A furious squall came up, and the waves broke over the boat, so that it was nearly swamped.

Jesus was in the stern, sleeping on a cushion. The disciples woke him and said to him, "Teacher, don't you care if we drown?" He got up, rebuked the wind and said to the waves, "Quiet! Be still!" Then the wind died down and it was completely calm. He said to his disciples, "Why are you so

afraid? Do you still have no faith?" They were terrified and asked each other, "Who is this? Even the wind and the waves obey him!"

(This is the word of the Lord All: Thanks be to God.)

Commentary

"Teacher, don't you care....?"

If you read through the first four chapters of Mark you will quickly recognise that the ministry of Jesus was not a peaceful one. Indeed it would be possible to say that it was characterised by scenes of terrible conflict. It all starts off well with the baptism and calling of the first disciples but it seems that Mark is just starting off by reassuring us who Jesus really was before all the trouble starts! Jesus is Son of God (1:1) but this serves only to prepare us for the battle to come. In Chapter 1 Verse 24 an evil spirit tells that Jesus has come to destroy and he goes on to drive out demons.

In Chapter 2 Verse 7 the religious leaders turn against him charging him with blasphemy. By Chapter 3 Verse 22 they are accusing him of being in league with Satan.

Then in Chapter 3 Verse 21 even some his own family have decided to arrest him because they think he has finally gone out of his mind, we learn in verse 31 that his mother went along with this.

Little surprise then that by Chapter 4: Verse 35, our reading today, that his own disciples accuse him of not caring from them.

The episode concerns a storm on the lake. Remember that these were hardened fishermen, so this was clearly a storm of some proportions. I wonder would we have behaved any differently if we were in that boat on Lake Galilee when the storm came and the waves started washing over the boat? Would the fact that you had Jesus with you have made any difference as you watched the water filling the inside of the sinking boat? Imagine no flares, no life jackets, no lifeboats, just you and the others and the imminent prospect of a dangerous swim. Undoubtedly the disciples were terrified, they had real fear and even the fact that Jesus was with them made no difference to their terror. The words of Jesus are a rebuke to the storm, but also a rebuke to the disciples "Why are you so afraid? Do you still have no faith?"

From his words should we conclude that Jesus expected the disciples to have been more calm? I doubt it, to be fearful in the face of life threatening situations is more likely to be a God given gift which helps us to survive, it is foolish to walk without fear into danger. I am sure that Jesus would have understood the adrenalin rush as the waves leapt over the boat and the concern of the disciples in the face of the storm. However Jesus would understandably be hurt by the critical words of the disciples which went further than fear and doubted his care and love for them. The words of the disciples to Jesus are a personal challenge to him, "Teacher, don't you care....?" The early Christian Church would have shared the same lives of confrontation as Jesus. They too knew the anger of the religious authorities, betrayal by friends and family. They would also have recognised evil in the world and understood that they were up against real spiritual evil. So they also may have been tempted to wonder whether Jesus cared for them when they were being killed for their faith. The answer to the question "Teacher, don't you care....?" was an emphatic YES!

So let us bring that message up to date and apply it to ourselves. You and I are in the boat and we face throughout our lives all manner of storms and crises which make us fearful. We cannot stop ourselves from being afraid when we are in perilous situations but we must never doubt that in that perilous situation Jesus is present with us and cares for us.

The early readers of Mark would have been reminded of the presence of their Risen Lord with them at all times, even in the face of organised state persecution and martyrdom. Only by trusting, even when we are afraid, can we come to know that same reassurance and peace which our Saviour brings.

Meditation

"Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine." Isaiah Chapter 43:1b

One of most commonly repeated phrases in Scripture is "Do not be afraid", and we still need to hear it today – loud and clear, "Do not be afraid!" Not because we are weak, but because there is a lot to be afraid of. Fear creeps in at night when we try to sleep, when we wait in a queue knowing we may be turned away, when we cannot give children what they need, when we face another demanding phone call; or anytime when we can see no way forward. Here the prophet Isaiah speaks right to our lives. You are not forgotten! God has pulled you back from the brink! God has named you and claimed you, and will not give you up for anything, no matter what happens. This verse was written originally to the people Israel who had lost everything and been carried off into exile in a foreign country. God did not give them up, and God will not give us up either. Do not be afraid! Revd Dr Jennifer Smith

The launch of the web map coincides with the launch of the new and improved Methodist Church website where the map can be viewed.

The map has been designed to enable people to view and explore churches, fellowship groups, projects, schools, and much more within their local contexts. As well as displaying a range of data about these places, groups and activities, the map allows users to find out what their communities are like. It shows land use, wealth, poverty and wellbeing in any given area, incorporating the latest available statistics from the Office of National Statistics and the Church's partner organisations. Church leaders hope that the data will improve people's understanding of local and national demographics, helping people to reach out to their local communities more effectively. Dr Christopher Stephens, Connexional Research and Statistics Coordinator, said: "This is a fantastic tool for the mission and ministry of the Church, both locally and nationally. The web map emerges from a strong demand from Methodists to see the data we collect about the Church reported in useful and flexible new ways. Maps provide a tool for presenting key information for mission planning in a clear and easy way. One future development will be to encourage Methodist members participating in church activities to upload photos, videos and text and begin online discussions attached to items featured on the map.

Footprints next walk on Sunday 1 July 2012 starting at 2.30pm is an interesting 3 mile walk centred on the ancient woodland of Marston Thrift. The route follows both existing Rights of Way and permissive paths within the woodland and across the countryside to the village of Cranfield. Marston Thrift is situated on the clay soil of the ridge and the paths can become very boggy during periods of excessive rain. The Marston Thrift car park is the starting point for this walk and this is situated at Wood End, which

is just off the old A421 approximately 4 miles northeast of junction 13 of the M1. From Bedford travel to the Little Chef roundabout on the old A421 where it ceased to be a dual carriageway (and can now be accessed from the new A421 exit to Marston Moretaine)., and take the road towards Husborne Crawley and the M1. Take the first turn right, which is signposted to Wood End and follow the winding road for 1.7 miles over the new road to the end where you will see the car park on the right.
