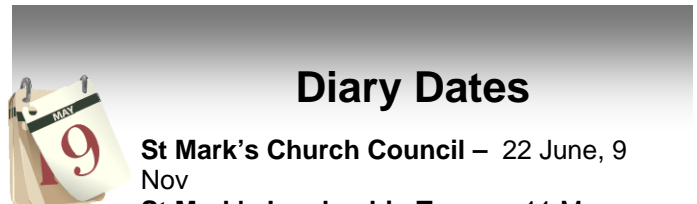

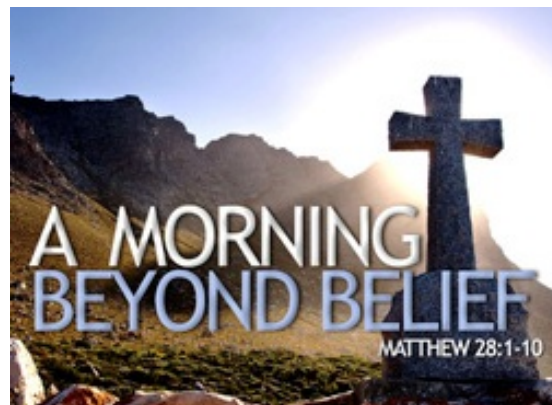

## Easter 3

**Opening Verse** 1 John 3:1 How great is the love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God

**First Bible Reading** Acts 3:12-19

When Peter saw this, he said to them: "Men of Israel, why does this surprise you? Why do you stare at us as if by our own power or godliness we had made this man walk? The God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, the God of our fathers, has glorified his servant Jesus. You handed him over to be killed, and you disowned him before Pilate, though he had decided to let him go. You disowned the Holy and Righteous One and asked that a murderer be released to you. You killed the author of life, but God raised him from the dead. We are witnesses of this. By faith in the name of Jesus, this man whom you see and know was made strong. It is Jesus' name and the faith that comes through him that has given this complete healing to him, as you can all see. "Now, brothers, I know that you acted in ignorance, as did your leaders. But this is how God fulfilled what he had foretold through all the prophets, saying that his Christ would suffer. Repent, then, and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out, that times of refreshing may come from the Lord. "(Reader: This is the word of the Lord – **Thanks be to God**)

**Second Reading** 1 John 3:1-7

How great is the love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are! The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. Dear friends, now we are children of God, and what we will be has not yet been made known. But we know that when he appears, we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is. Everyone who has this hope in him purifies himself, just as he is pure. Everyone who sins breaks the law; in fact, sin is lawlessness. But you know that he appeared so that he might take away our sins. And in him is no sin. No one who lives in him keeps on sinning. No one who continues to sin has either seen him or known him. Dear children, do not let anyone lead you astray. He who does what is right is righteous, just as he is righteous. – **Thanks be to God**)

**Gospel Reading** Luke 24:36b-48 (*When announced* **All: Glory to Christ our Saviour**)

While they were still talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." They were startled and frightened, thinking they saw a ghost.

He said to them, "Why are you troubled, and why do doubts rise in your minds? Look at my hands and my feet. It is I myself! Touch me and see; a ghost does not have flesh and bones, as you see I have." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and feet. And while they still did not believe it because of joy and amazement, he asked them, "Do you have anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of broiled fish, and he took it and ate it in their presence.

He said to them, "This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms." Then he opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures. He told them, "This is what is written: The Christ will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, and repentance and forgiveness of sins will be preached in his name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. I am going to send you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high." (Reader: This is the Gospel of Christ– **All: Praise to Christ our Lord** )

**Post Communion Prayer**

Living God, your Son made himself known to his disciples in the breaking of bread: open the eyes of our faith, that we may see him in all his redeeming work; who is alive and reigns, now and for ever. Amen

## Commentary

I often speak with people who tell me that the reason why they do not come to church is because they would not be able to agree with everything which the churches expects from them. Now obviously there are some people who are just looking for any excuse not to have to get out of bed in the morning. Others are avoiding the challenges which the church makes and are looking for an easy way out. However there are many other people who are genuine and who struggle with what they think the church expects from them at an intellectual level. For many people they cannot pretend that they ascent to a whole load of creed and theology which they think the church expects from them.

This raises for us a great many questions, but perhaps the first question is this - do we expect that those who gather together and call themselves a church all believe the same things about theology, ethics, society and so on? Would we want a church in which everybody had to sign up on a dotted line to make sure that they were sound and orthodox? It reminds me of the film in which the men in an American community called Stepford find a way of making ideal wives who do everything the men want and don't think for themselves. They end up with perfect robot partners. Every wife looks perfect, cooking and cleaning dutifully for their husbands. It might sound great at first, but of course it isn't, nobody would really want to be married to a robotic Stepford Wife.

So we must ask ourselves, is the church about conformity and moving everybody along so that they inhabit the same space in respect of belief and lifestyle? Are we looking for Stepford Christians? It might be desirable for some insecure pastors of churches who want congregations which are clones of themselves, but actually it brainwashing, a form of intellectual imprisonment. I would much rather have people in church who felt able to be honest about their doubts and fears. True conviction is not about expressing the same thing in a louder voice, we must be able to tackle the complex questions of faith and work out what salvation means for us in the cauldron of this life.

Frederick Buechner wrote (*Beyond Words*)

*'If you don't have doubts, you are either kidding yourself or are asleep.'*

So it should come as an encouragement to us to learn that the first disciples struggled to come to terms even with the fact that Jesus had risen from the dead. Jesus met with the disciples and clearly even after touching him, some of them still found belief difficult. Now we do not have the enormous privilege of touching Jesus, so clearly there are times when our faith is going to be put to the test. Moreover even the most ardent believers disagree profoundly about what everything from ethics and lifestyle choices, to basic Biblical belief. As an example there are many Christians around the world who believe that Jonah really did live inside a fish, other Christians read such stories as an illustrated parable or story with a meaning. For some Christians, having room to manoeuvre in their beliefs is unsettling and they prefer to be told exactly what they should believe and not have to think about it too deeply. However for others it is reassuring to know that nobody has all the answers and it is OK to be a part of a church and work through our questions without being expected to conform to the beliefs of others. The Apostle Paul said that now we are groping around in the dark, we do not see things clearly, but one day we will see Jesus face to face. (1 Cor 13). Until that time we have to be prepared to admit our limited understandings and be very open to listen and learn from each other. *Charles Royden*

## New Bishop a Step Closer

In a legal and liturgical ceremony that has been part of church practice since the third century, the Rt Revd Alan Smith received the care, government and administration of the bishopric of St Albans on 31st March.

The Confirmation of Election, as it is known follows the Election of the Bishop by the College of Canons of the Cathedral which took place on 13th February. These two ceremonies historically reflect the acceptance of an Episcopal appointment by the diocese and the wider church.

Although an ancient ceremony, the wording used in the confirmation has been gradually modernised. The service ends with the Archbishop of Canterbury giving the new Bishop his charge for the Diocese and in this respect the ceremony is entirely contemporary.

In his address the Archbishop referred to pastoral ministry as being an “eye opening matter. It is a matter not only of holding up to people a vision of where they are going but also a vision of who they are. He connected the role of a bishop to seeing and speaking the truth about God and those who the bishop serves. He concluded: “Keep your eyes open. Look to God who has called you. Look to Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of your faith. Look so that you may see all things as they are, and all people as they are, seeing them with a justice, a generosity and the imagination with which God sees them.”

Bishop Alan's inauguration will take place on 19th September 2009.

## Methodist Church launches Business Sunday to connect with business life

As the recession continues to dig in its heels, the Methodist Church is pioneering ways to bridge the gap between work and place of worship. May 3 will see the first Business Sunday, a day when leaders of Methodist services will be encouraged to connect their sermons with the whole world of work.

Business Sunday was an idea instigated by Vice-President of the Methodist Conference, David Walton, following an ethical business consultation at the Martin Luther King Centre in Manchester in October. The date May 3 was chosen because of its proximity to Labour Day and Rogation Sunday; two festivals which remember the joys and trials of working life. David, who is a partner of a solicitors' firm in Manchester, said: “In all the discussions I have been having with people all over the country, there has been a significant concern that we are not spending enough time making the link between our faith and our working lives. We often include doctors and teachers in our prayers, but we don't pray for the entrepreneurs, estate agents, accountants or people working in industry and commerce generally.

“Business Sunday is part of an initiative to support and encourage those people. The emphasis is not on creating yet another special Sunday in the calendar every year, but on having worship and study material available to help leaders support and value those in their congregations who are often facing tough decisions and ethical dilemmas in their working lives.”

There are 150 Methodist workplace chaplains working with people in industry and commerce, from Bluewater Shopping Centre through to Asda. Rev Rob Jones, Chaplaincies Coordinator, said: “We pray for teachers and health workers, but when do we pray for people working on the shop floor of a car manufacturer? We don't, on the whole, we don't see the faith link, but in actual fact these people carry their faith into the work place in a vigorous and often a very creative way and we want to support them in what they do.”

Resources, including service plans, will be available from today on the Methodist Church website. A Facebook-styled website aimed at fostering a network of support for like-minded people is in development. The idea follows on from the work of former Vice President John Bell who, as a former director of Philips, encouraged churches to engage actively with business life. David will be at a meeting of 70 Methodist local lay preachers and worship leaders in Bolton on May 3 for the launch of Business Sunday.

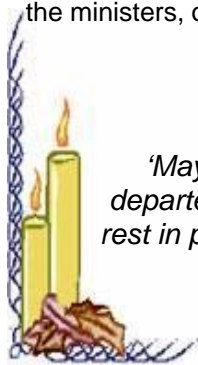
