First Bible Reading - Jeremiah 14: 7-10, 19-22

Although our sins testify against us, O LORD, do something for the sake of your name. For our backsliding is great; we have sinned against you. O Hope of Israel, its Saviour in times of distress, why are you like a stranger in the land, like a traveller who stays only a night? Why are you like a man taken by surprise, like a warrior powerless to save?

Gospel Reading - Luke 18: 9-14

To some who were confident of their own righteousness and looked down on everybody else, Jesus told this parable: "Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee stood up and prayed about himself: 'God, I thank you that I am not like other men--robbers, evildoers, adulterers--or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week and give a tenth of all I get.' "But the tax collector stood at a distance. He would not even look up to heaven, but beat his breast and said, 'God, have mercy on me, a sinner.' "I tell you that this man, rather than the other, went home justified before God. For everyone

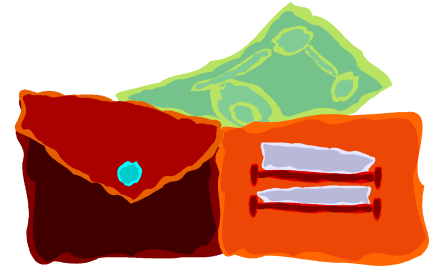

Commentary - A Missionary Heart

Mission Sunday is a time to look back at the Mission activities of the churches over the past year and to give thanks to God for His generosity to us and in turn thank all those who have been involved in supporting mission in our churches over the past years through their unselfish giving of money, time and effort. To this needs to be added activities and giving such as Christian Aid and the many other unseen mission projects we are quietly involved in as individuals and groups. To all those



involved, and to all those who give so generously, either to specific projects or through the weekly offerings or standing orders, to those who organise and participate in coffee mornings and sponsored events, to those who work tirelessly and faithfully in the background for mission in our Partnership; thank you. Looking forward, we will continue with our regular mission activities at each church and this year are supporting BeCHaR and Keech Cottage Children's Hospice in our Autumn projects at St Mark's and Putnoe Heights respectively. If you would like to be involved in one of these projects please pick up an envelope after the service or ask one of the Mission Team or Ministers for further details. Please let us know if you would like to be involved in a more practical way in our mission activities.

Our bible readings today have a missionary theme to them. In today's gospel reading it's perhaps surprising that Jesus does not use the story to deride and undermine the Pharisee, and all that he stood for, and make some pithy comments about the misguided nature of the Jews in general at the same time. Elsewhere in the gospels Jesus frequently criticises Pharisees and so we are almost preconditioned to think that all Pharisees are and anyone else that appears in the same story must be good. And that's true to a certain extent. But Pharisees genuinely try to uphold the Torah in a world where Roman power and Samaritan neighbours tempted people to compromise. Pharisees genuinely try to please God. Tax collectors, on the other hand, collaborate with Romans and steal from Jews. But rather than condemning the Pharisee, Jesus uses the parable to demonstrate what happens when our hearts and lives are not yet transformed by the love of God. It's a significant role reversal. Perhaps if we imagine a homeless person sitting at the back of church as the one going home 'justified before God' after a service not only does the parable become a little more challenging it helps us to understand the point Jesus is trying to make.

Living out our Christian lives is more than just going through the motions. Unless our hearts and lives are transformed by the love of God our motivations and actions, although well intentioned, will be misguided. Perhaps the Pharisee thought that God would be impressed by his boasting, perhaps he thought he was better than others: "I thank you, God, that I am not grasping, unjust, adulterous like the rest of people, and particularly that I am not like this tax collector here..." To have to proclaim that we are better than others betrays the inner fear that we are not and trying to put others down, to elevate ourselves, is just a self-destroying waste of energy. And whilst we would all want to identify with, and be identified with, the humble tax collector, there is always a bit of the Pharisee in us all that wants to come out from time to time. A constant reminder that we need to be vigilant in putting God and not ourselves first in our lives. Looking out for the needs of others, not because we are looking for opportunities to do good and self aggrandisement, but because we want to show the world the power of God's love and forgiveness and that though us He can make a difference. This is none other than to have a missionary heart.

The gospel shows us that we are not to judge others for what they appear to be but to treat others as equals in the sight of God so that we can all be transformed by His love. This means turning our well meant words and intentions into actions every day. *Sam Cappleman*

Meditation

At one time or another and to a greater or lesser degree we all try to justify ourselves. Society is relentless in demanding proofs and justifications from us, and it's easy to take the bait. But to live without self-justification makes us feel vulnerable and exposed. But when living without self-justifications can be extraordinarily liberating. As soon as we accept that we're accepted by a good God, we never, for any reason, need to prove ourselves. To get to that position Jesus says that we need only seven words—those mumbled by the tax collector as he stood at a distance and stared at the ground: "God, have mercy on me, a sinner." The moment we breathe those words and cast our unadorned selves upon God, we experience His love without conditions or limits. Correctly understood, and spoken from the heart, this is the most important prayer anyone can utter, and in a sense the only prayer we ever need. Why? Because it comes from a clear-eyed appraisal of our human condition and, more importantly, from confidence in the character of a God who welcomes the secular sinner—and even the self-righteous saint.
