# First Reading - Malachi 3: 1-5

"See, I will send my messenger, who will prepare the way before me. Then suddenly the Lord you are seeking will come to his temple; the messenger of the covenant, whom you desire, will come," says the LORD Almighty. But who can endure the day of his coming? Who can stand when he appears? For he will be like a refiner's fire or a launderer's soap. He will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver; he will purify the Levites and refine them like gold and silver. Then the LORD will have men who will bring offerings in righteousness, and the offerings of Judah and Jerusalem will be acceptable to the LORD, as in days gone by, as in former years. "So I will come near to you for judgment. I will be quick to testify against sorcerers, adulterers and perjurers, against those who defraud labourers of their wages, who oppress the widows and the fatherless, and deprive aliens of justice, but do not fear me," says the LORD Almighty.

# Second Reading - Hebrews 2: 14-18

Since the children have flesh and blood, he too shared in their humanity so that by his death he might destroy him who holds the power of death—that is, the devil— and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by their fear of death. For surely it is not angels he helps, but Abraham's descendants. For this reason he had to be made like his brothers in every way, in order that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in service to God, and that he might make atonement for the sins of the people. Because he himself suffered when he was tempted, he is able to help those who are being tempted. (Reader: This is the word of the Lord. **All: Thanks be to God** 

Third Reading - Luke 2: 22- 40 ( When the gospel is announced - Glory to Christ our Saviour) When the time of their purification according to the Law of Moses had been completed, Joseph and Mary took him to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord (as it is written in the Law of the Lord, "Every firstborn male is to be consecrated to the Lord"), and to offer a sacrifice in keeping with what is said in the Law of the Lord: "a pair of doves or two young pigeons." Now there was a man in Jerusalem called Simeon, who was righteous and devout. He was waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not die before he had seen the Lord's Christ. Moved by the Spirit, he went into the temple courts. When the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what the custom of the Law required, Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying: "Sovereign Lord, as you have promised, you now dismiss your servant in peace. For my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the sight of all people, a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel." The child's father and mother marvelled at what was said about him. Then Simeon blessed them and said to Mary, his mother: "This child is destined to cause the falling and rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be spoken against, so that the thoughts of many hearts will be revealed. And a sword will pierce your own soul too." There was also a prophetess, Anna, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was very old; she had lived with her husband seven years after her marriage,

and then was a widow until she was eighty-four. She never left the temple but worshiped night and day, fasting and praying. Coming up to them at that very moment, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were looking forward to the redemption of Jerusalem.

When Joseph and Mary had done everything required by the Law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee to their own town of Nazareth. And the child grew and became strong; he was filled with wisdom, and the grace of God was upon him. (Reader: This is the Gospel of Christ. **All: Thanks be to God**)

# Commentary

Dear friends: Today is our celebration of the Feast of Candlemass. The feast of Candlemass always falls on 2 February and marks the purification of the Virgin Mary and the Presentation of the baby Jesus in the Temple. These two ceremonies take place forty days after the birth of a child according to Jewish law. Candlemass is celebrated on the Sunday closest to February 2.

As forty days ago we celebrated the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ. Now we recall the day on which he was presented in the Temple, when he was offered to the Father and shown to his people. As a sign of his coming among us, his mother was purified, as we now come to him for cleansing. In their old age Simeon and Anna recognised him as their Lord, as we today sing of his glory.

Today we celebrate both the joy of his coming and his searching judgement, looking back to the day of his birth and forward to the coming days of his passion. Like many Christians festivals, including Christmas itself, Candlemas has roots which lie deep in pagan roots and an understanding of nature. Candlemass lies half way between the winter solstice and the spring equinox, so it marks the day upon which winter is half over! Candlemas is a watershed in the church year, it marks the point at which we take a last look back at Christmas and then turn our minds firmly towards the Easter cross. We have been working through the Sundays of Epiphany, now we leave them behind and soon it will be Lent, for this reason it has been called a 'bitter-sweet Sunday.' *Charles Royden*



From 21 to 28 December 2005 I stayed at the Smile Centre in Gjakove, Kosova our mission to deliver 2000 shoe boxes full of gifts and tell the story of Jesus' birth to children in schools, Churches and Kindergarten around Gjakove. I worked as part of a team of 7 collecting packs of shoe boxes each day from the store near the centre of Gjakove and taking them to schools. kindergarten and day centre for disabled children as well as to a lady living in a remote village with her 4 children and husband who had fallen off a roof a year ago breaking his leg which was not yet healed. In both Kindergarten and school we were made very welcome by staff and pupils and many of the children thanked us for their presents individually. We had a lot of fun singing Christmas carols and telling the Christmas story very simply, phrase by phrase so that our interpreters could translate for us. If ever I had any doubt about whether the Shoe box appeals are worthwhile, I can tell you now, that I have personally seen the delight on many children's faces as they open these boxes so lovingly packed.
