First Bible Reading - Isaiah 50:4-9a

The Sovereign LORD has given me an instructed tongue, to know the word that sustains the weary. He wakens me morning by morning, wakens my ear to listen like one being taught. The Sovereign LORD has opened my ears, and I have not been rebellious; I have not drawn back. I offered my back to those who beat me, my cheeks to those who pulled out my ear; I did not hide my face from mocking and spitting. Because the Sovereign LORD helps me, I will not be disgraced. Therefore have I set my face like flint, and I know I will not be put to shame. He who vindicates me is near. Who then will bring charges against me? Let us face each other! Who is my accuser? Let him confront me! It is the Sovereign LORD who helps me. Who is he that will condemn me? They will all wear out like a garment; the moths will eat them up.

Second Bible Reading - Philippians 2:5-11

Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus: Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, but made himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself and became obedient to death-- even death on a cross! Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Gospel Reading - Mark 11:1-11

(Please stand when the reading is announced - Glory to Christ our Saviour)

As they approached Jerusalem and came to Bethphage and Bethany at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples, saying to them, "Go to the village ahead of you, and just as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, which no one has ever ridden. Untie it and bring it here. If anyone asks you, 'Why are you doing this?' tell him, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here shortly.' "

They went and found a colt outside in the street, tied at a doorway. As they untied it, some people standing there asked, "What are you doing, untying that colt?" They answered as Jesus had told them to, and the people let them go. When they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks over it, he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, while others spread branches they had cut in the fields. Those who went ahead and those who followed shouted. "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" "Blessed is the coming kingdom of our father David!" "Hosanna in the highest!"

Jesus entered Jerusalem and went to the temple. He looked around at everything, but since it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the Twelve.

Commentary

Palm Sunday is the beginning of Holy week, a time of incredible change, which progresses through a 'roller coaster' of emotions; excitement, joy, anger, love, fellowship, betrayal, anguish, denial, and ultimately a humiliating and agonising death.

For me, the readings of Lent this year have demonstrated Jesus at his most human, experiencing emotions I can recognise, both from my own life and from the lives of those amongst whom I minister. I find it easier to identify with this Jesus, and see how his teaching can be so relevant to my own life, yet it is leading to a decision I fear I could not make.

Today's gospel reading starts with Jesus and his disciples arriving at the Mount of Olives, just outside Jerusalem, and a place where we return for his last moments of earthly 'fellowship' on Thursday evening, as he retires to pray after the Passover meal with those closest to him. They were in Jerusalem to celebrate the festival of Passover, as many did every year, people were gathering from many different places to celebrate. Jerusalem was such an important place, in many ways the 'home' of the Jewish faith, and a place about which many prophecies were written. Indeed, the very act of Jesus riding into Jerusalem on a donkey recalls the passage from Zechariah;

'Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion. Shout aloud O daughter of Jerusalem. Lo, your king comes to you, triumphant and victorious is he, riding on an ass and upon a colt the foal of an ass.'

In the midst of the 'hubbub' of such a regular gathering it seems like this time there was an added air of anticipation, as if people were expecting something dramatic to happen. People in an occupied homeland can, understandably, be keen for change and Jesus offered them hope. The crowds that had gathered, swelling the population of Jerusalem to a seething mass, now line up to welcome this leader they had heard about, perhaps feeling that he would be the one who would save them from their oppressors.

As for a 'triumphal entry' he arrives, not 'in style' but in humility. The crowds, however, appear to welcome him as royalty, spreading their cloaks on the road in similar fashion to when Jehu was anointed King (2 Kings 9:13). Jesus was treated as royalty, and this is perhaps, ultimately, what tipped the balance of Rome in favour of his critics, a man that could hold such admiration was clearly a threat to a people who at times suggested their own Emperor was a god.

I can't help but wonder if doubts were being seeded too in the minds of those who welcomed him, arriving on such a small beast was poles apart from the triumphal Roman processions that many of them would have familiar with. Was this truly a man that could overthrow?

People can be so fickle, within the space of a week the cry of the crowd had changed from one of welcome to one of hatred. Are we any different today? How often are our sports personalities, Actors, TV presenters and politicians built up only to be eagerly torn down at the slightest hint of failure or 'wrongdoing', their 'dirty laundry' being drawn out in the media, as if it were public property.

The palm crosses we receive represent the opposites of Holy week, symbolising both the bright and vibrant palm branches waved by the crowd and the dead wood of the cross this road led to. When you look at yours, maybe it can help remind you that there is always hope. Even in the

midst of his anguish Jesus found it within himself to forgive, to reach out to others and to ensure those he cared about would be looked after, and he does this still for each one of us today.

Our faith does not protect us from hard times, yet through it we are set among people who can support us, and given the gifts to come through, changed, but stronger because of it. Today's service also includes the gift of sharing in communion, with the offer of prayer for healing. Healing was such an integral part of Jesus' ministry, and for each of us, whatever our needs we are welcome before him, for in his own brokenness there is healing. *Deacon Jane Mills*

That we, with those who have died in faith, may find mercy in the day of Christ, let us pray to the Lord. **All Lord, have mercy.**

Maundy Thursday

7.30pm at Putnoe Heights Church

On the night before his death Jesus had a final meal with his friends. Before this festival meal for Passover, Jesus surprised his friends by washing the feet of every person, a task that was normally done by a servant. He wanted to show his followers that they should love one another in humble ways. Later in the meal, which is known as 'The Last Supper', Jesus passed round bread and wine. He said the bread was his body broken for them and the wine was his blood shed for them. He was telling them that he was going to die and that when they share bread and wine they should remember him. We share bread and wine at church services all year round, but it is even more special on Maundy Thursday.

This is a particularly moving service as we read the Gospel accounts of the events leading up to Jesus arrest and crucifixion.
