Bible Notes



Verse of Scripture Matthew Chapter 2:1

After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi from the east came to Jerusalem and asked, "Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star in the east and have come to worship him."

A Collect Prayer - Before we read we pray

Eternal God, by a star you led wise men to the worship of your Son. Guide by your light the nations of the earth, that the whole world may see your glory, through Jesus Christ our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

First Reading Jeremiah 31:7-14

This is what the LORD says: "Sing with joy for Jacob; shout for the foremost of the nations. Make your praises heard, and say, 'O LORD, save your people, the remnant of Israel.' See, I will bring them from the land of the north and gather them from the ends of the earth. Among them will be the blind and the lame, expectant mothers and women in labor; a great throng will return. They will come with weeping; they will pray as I bring them back. I will lead them beside streams of water on a level path where they will not stumble, because I am Israel's father, and Ephraim is my firstborn son. "Hear the word of the LORD, O nations; proclaim it in distant coastlands: 'He who scattered Israel will gather them and will watch over his flock like a shepherd.' For the LORD will ransom Jacob and redeem them from the hand of those stronger than they. They will come and shout for joy on the heights of Zion; they will rejoice in the bounty of the LORD-- the grain, the new wine and the oil, the young of the flocks and herds. They will be like a well-watered garden, and they will sorrow no more. Then maidens will dance and be glad, young men and old as well. I will turn their mourning into gladness; I will give them comfort and joy instead of sorrow. I will satisfy the priests with abundance, and my people will be filled with my bounty," declares the LORD. (Reader : This is the word of the Lord. **All: Thanks be to God**)

Second Reading Ephesians 1:3-14

Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in the heavenly realms with every spiritual blessing in Christ. For he chose us in him before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in his sight. In love he predestined us to be adopted as his sons through Jesus Christ, in accordance with his pleasure and will--to the praise of his glorious grace, which he has freely given us in the One he loves. In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace that he lavished on us with all wisdom and understanding. And he made known to us the mystery of his will according to his good pleasure, which he purposed in Christ, to be put into effect when the times will have reached their fulfillment--to bring all things in heaven and on earth together under one head, even Christ. In him we were also chosen, having been predestined according to the plan of him who works out everything in conformity with the purpose of his will, in order that we, who were the first to hope in Christ, might be for the praise of his glory. And you also were included in Christ when you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation. Having believed, you were marked in him with a seal, the promised Holy Spirit, who is a deposit guaranteeing our inheritance until the redemption of those who are God's possession--to the praise of his glory. (Reader: This is the word of the Lord - **All: Thanks be to God**)

Gospel Reading John 1:1-18

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning. Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. In him was life, and that life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, but the darkness has not understood it. There came a man who was sent from God; his name was John. He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through him all

men might believe. He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light. The true light that gives light to every man was coming into the world. He was in the world, and though the world was made through him, the world did not recognize him. He came to that which was his own, but his own did not receive him. Yet to all who received him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God-- children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God. The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth. John testifies concerning him. He cries out, saying, "This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me has surpassed me because he was before me.'" From the fullness of his grace we have all received one blessing after another. For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God, but God the One and Only, who is at the Father's side, has made him known. (Reader: This is the Gospel of Christ -**All: Praise to Christ our Lord**)

MRDF LAUNCHES ASIA EARTHQUAKE APPEAL

The Methodist Relief and Development Fund has launched an appeal to aid the victims of the earthquake that struck Asia and has so far caused about tens of thousands of deaths. Anyone wishing to contribute directly to the appeal should send a cheque payable to MRDF to 25 Marylebone Road, London, NW1 5JR, with a covering note saying that it is for the Asian earthquake fund.

Our own churches are raising money which we will send to MRDF direct. If you would like to give simply make your donation and give it to a member of the Leadership Team or our treasurers direct, John Day (St Mark's Email: treasurer@thisischurch.com) and Kathryn Morse (Putnoe Email: treasurerph@thisischurch.com). It would be helpful if you included your donation in an envelope, which can be obtained from the church office with your name and address stating that the gift can be Gift Aided. This will allow us to reclaim tax.

The Appeal

Kevin Fray, MRDF Supporter Relations Co-ordinator, said "many of us were shocked to see the scenes of destruction after the earthquake and waves struck across a wide part of the Asia Pacific region. MRDF will send the funds raised to the local relief agencies who need it most. We will as usual work closely with ACT to ensure that donations go quickly and effectively to those who are suffering."

MRDF partner Action by Churches Together (ACT) has already started aiding efforts by ecumenical church groups to provide food, shelter and medical supplies to the affected areas. In Sri Lanka, where more than 5,800 people are said to have died, the National Council of Churches in Sri Lanka (NCCSL) reports that two truckloads of essential food items and water will leave today for Muttur in Trincomalee and the other to Thirukovil in Batticaloa, two of the worst hit areas.

In India, ACT member Church's Auxiliary for Social Action (CASA) reports that 12 teams have been deployed, both assisting and assessing needs of people in the coastal areas. Four strategic operational points are being set up: two in Tamil Nadu at Trichy and Drinamvenny, one in Andhra Pradesh, and another one in Kerala to assist some 50,000 families. The official death toll in India so far is more than 4,000 people. CASA however reports that the churches in the coastal regions are reporting more deaths as news trickles in from smaller and more remote villages and areas.

In Indonesia, where more than 4,400 people are believed to have died, ACT members Yayasan

Tanggul Benkana (YTB), Yakkum Emergency Unit/CD Bethesda (YEU) and Church World Service (CWS) are co-ordinating their response to the emergency. CWS will conduct a rapid assessment mission to Aceh this week, working with a team from YEU. YTB reports that figures received from Aceh province puts those displaced at some 150,000 people. YEU will also be sending an assessment team to North Sumatra.

Lunch Club

Since the unexpected closure of Gold, due to lack of finances, a slimmed down operation has been operated by Social Services. This has been of enormous help to people with learning disabilities who have depended on that group for support. We were delighted when an award from the European Social Fund of £160,000 was made to St Mark's to enable them to take on staff and provide a service which will be able to provide for the needs of these existing members. The funding is strictly monitored to ensure compliance with the stated objectives of enabling people with learning disabilities to enter meaningful employment. It is apparent that providing the training plans and operating this service on two sites is not satisfactory and the Management Committee have been asked to try and make it easier for the new group 'Clubhouse' by operating at St Mark's on all three days.

This would only be possible if alternative and satisfactory arrangement could be found for the Lunch Club. This week Lunch Club leaders met and discussed a proposal that the Lunch Club move to Putnoe Heights Church. The leaders recognised that there would need for alternative transport arrangements and some logistical changes if this were to be possible. However they were overwhelmingly supportive and kindly agreed that they would be prepared to move to allow the work with people with learning disabilities to succeed. The change will not be effective immediately but will take place after consultation with members in the New Year. Therefore expect the first Lunch Club gatherings to be at St Mark's as usual and any changes will be announced beforehand.

For some people this change will make things easier, for others it will be more difficult and we will need to ensure that transport is provided so that nobody is unable to continue. The Management Committee at St Mark's are grateful to Lunch Club and everybody at Putnoe who have co-operated to enable them to meet the difficulties with which they have been presented. It is yet another blessing which has come from the Partnership of our two churches. **Thank you for your understanding and patience.**

In a personal letter to Anglican leaders in the region Dr Williams said:

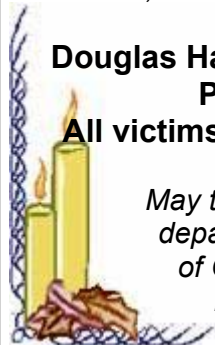
