First Bible Reading - Revelation Chapter 7: 9-17

After this I looked and there before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and in front of the Lamb. They were wearing white robes and were holding palm branches in their hands. And they cried out in a loud voice: "Salvation belongs to our God, who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb." All the angels were standing around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures. They fell down on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, saying: "Amen! Praise and glory and wisdom and thanks and honour and power and strength be to our God for ever and ever. Amen!" Then one of the elders asked me, "These in white robes—who are they, and where did they come from?" I answered, "Sir, you know." And he said, "These are they who have come out of the great tribulation; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. Therefore, "they are before the throne of God and serve him day and night in his temple; and he who sits on the throne will spread his tent over them. Never again will they hunger; never again will they thirst. The sun will not beat upon them, nor any scorching heat. For the Lamb at the centre of the throne will be their shepherd; he will lead them to springs of living water. And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes." (This is the word of the Lord – **Thanks be to God**)

Second Bible Reading 1 John 3: 1-3

How great is the love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are! The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. Dear friends, now we are children of God, and what we will be has not yet been made known. But we know that when he appears, we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is. Everyone who has this hope in him purifies himself, just as he is pure. (This is the word of the Lord-- **Thanks be to God**)

Gospel Reading - Mathew 5: 1-12

Now when he saw the crowds, he went up on a mountainside and sat down. His disciples came to him, and he began to teach them saying: "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted. Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth. Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled. Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy. Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called sons of God. Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. "Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me. Rejoice and be glad, because great is your reward in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you. (This is the word of the Lord - **Thanks be to God**)

Commentary

'The word 'saint' is used both for the figure in a stained-glass window and for the humble, self-effacing Christian down the street. In the Apostle Paul's New Testament letters Christians were addressed as the 'holy ones'. In following centuries people who had attracted others to holiness were declared a holy person or saint by a local bishop at their funeral. It does not matter what we call them: it does matter that we be one.' Words of Ray Simpson, Anglican priest, founding member of the Community of Aiden and Hilda and author of books on Celtic Spirituality in his book 'Waymarks for the Journey'. Words that for me sum up the Christian celebration of 'All Saints Day' held on 1 November. It was first instigated by Pope Boniface in 609AD to remember all martyrs and celebrated on 13 May, in 837AD Pope Gregory IV extended the festival to remember all the saints, changed its name to 'Feast of All Saints' and moved it to 1st November. In Mathew 5: 1 – 12, the passage commonly referred to as 'The Beatitudes', we hear Jesus' words describe as 'Blessed', or 'Happy', those who suffer in a variety of ways; together with those who offer support to the suffering. For many thousands of saints today that suffering is as real for them as it was for those early followers of Jesus who first heard Jesus' words, which were and are intended to both enlighten and encourage. The image we are likely to recall when we hear the word saint is of a person with a 'halo' round their head, images that abound in art, images that portray, predominately, male pious people clutching Bibles, or with hands in a position of prayer. Is this the image we are to aspire to; is it the image that the Beatitudes describe? Perhaps for some it is, some saints were and still are called to live lives of Biblical study, silent contemplation and prayer, but for many this is not the case. They are called to study, pray and work in the most desperate places with the most despairing people, with the poor in spirit; the bereaved; the meek; the hungry and the thirsty; the persecuted. These are the saints that show mercy; seek justice; are the peacemakers, but to do this they need to be pure in heart and see God in all that they are exposed to. These are the unseen saints who in all parts of society are making a difference inspired and guided by the Holy Spirit.

In his recently published book 'Saints and Pilgrims in the Diocese of St Albans', (a copy is on display in St Mark's chapel), Bishop Alan has compiled brief biographies of 366 Christian people who, over nearly 2000 years, have shaped the area now covered by our diocese, Included are bishops, doctors, members of parliament, missionaries, priests, poets and some saints with halos. But those that I'm drawn to are the previously unknown stalwarts of our churches and communities who have responded to God's call upon them by quietly and diligently serving Him by serving others. Two examples who attracted my attention are:

Basil Carr

Born in 1924, he died in 2011. It is unlikely that anyone, other than those who knew him, have heard of him. Basil's wife was very involved in the church which made him curious to know why, so he went along to church activities, later he became churchwarden and with his wife began a charismatic prayer group. Eventually he trained to be Reader, despite his initial misgivings about his lack of further education, and was licensed in Elstow, which is on the south side of Bedford. His talent was articulating the faith in a way which ordinary people could understand.

He also had the capacity to empathise with those who were experiencing problems in their personal lives.

Jennifer Worth

Who was recently made famous by the TV series 'Call the Midwife', a series based on her life as a midwife in the East End of London in the 1950's, where she was based at a convent. Her connection to this Diocese is that when she married in 1963 she moved to Hemel Hempstead. In her book 'Farewell to the East End' she writes 'Nuns were not my style I couldn't be doing with that sort of thing, I thought I wanted adventure not religion. I did not know it at the time, but my soul was yearning for both'. She became a very devout Christian but kept quiet about her faith.

Last week in Junior Church, when we talked about 'saints' I was most humbled when, after some thought, one of our young children asked "Was Martin Luther King a saint?". Such insight and understanding in one so young emphasised to me the importance of providing opportunities for our younger saints to explore and learn about our Christian faith.

Basil Carr, Jennifer Worth and Martin Luther King are three examples of people who knew their need of God, who followed in the footsteps of Jesus and were empowered to do so by the Holy Spirit, holy people who wore their halos round their heart not their head. *Wendy Waters*

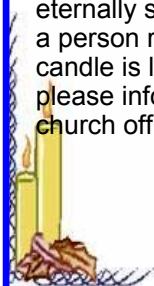
