Advent 2

Opening Verse of Scripture —Mark 1:2,3

It is written in Isaiah the prophet: "I will send my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way"-- "a voice of one calling in the desert, 'Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him.'"

God of all holiness, your promises stand unshaken through all generations and you lift up all who are burdened and brought low; renew our hope in you, as we wait for the coming in glory of Jesus Christ our Judge and Saviour, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God world without end. Comfort, comfort my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and proclaim to her that her hard service has been completed, that her sin has been paid for, that she has received from the Lord's hand double for all her sins. Every valley shall be raised up, every mountain and hill made low; the rough ground shall become level, the rugged places a plain. And the glory of the LORD will be revealed, and all mankind together will see it. For the mouth of the LORD has spoken." A voice says, "Cry out." And I said, "What shall I cry?" "All men are like grass, and all their glory is like the flowers of the field. The grass withers and the flowers fall, because the breath of the LORD blows on them. Surely the people are grass. The grass withers and the flowers fall, but the word of our God stands forever." You who bring good tidings to Zion, go up on a high mountain. You who bring good tidings to

Jerusalem, lift up your voice with a shout, lift it up, do not be afraid; say to the towns of Judah, "Here is your God!" See, the Sovereign LORD comes with power, and his arm rules for him. See, his reward is with him, and his recompense accompanies him. He tends his flock like a shepherd: He gathers the lambs in his arms and carries them close to his heart; he gently leads those that have young.

Second Reading - 2 Peter 3:8-15a

But do not forget this one thing, dear friends: With the Lord a day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like a day. The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. He is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance. But the day of the Lord will come like a thief. The heavens will disappear with a roar; the elements will be destroyed by fire, and the earth and everything in it will be laid bare. Since everything will be destroyed in this way, what kind of people ought you to be? You ought to live holy and godly lives as you look forward to the day of God and speed its coming. That day will bring about the destruction of the heavens by fire, and the elements will melt in the heat. But in keeping with his promise we are looking forward to a new heaven and a new earth, the home of righteousness. So then, dear friends, since you are looking forward to this, make every effort to be found spotless, blameless and at peace with him. Bear in mind that our Lord's patience means salvation, just as our dear brother Paul also wrote you with the wisdom that God gave him.

Gospel Reading - Mark 1: 1-8

The beginning of the gospel about Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

It is written in Isaiah the prophet: "I will send my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way"-- "a voice of one calling in the desert, 'Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him.'"

And so John came, baptizing in the desert region and preaching a baptism of repentance for the



forgiveness of sins. The whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem went out to him. Confessing their sins, they were baptized by him in the Jordan River.

John wore clothing made of camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. And this was his message: "After me will come one more powerful than I, the thongs of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. I baptize you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

Commentary

We've got it all going on today, Advent 2, Baptism and Christingle, three great celebrations in their own right, linked today by the use of candles.

Advent 2, today we light a candle for Peace, as we recall the prophets who fortold of Jesus birth, and the peace that promises. In the Gospel we are also reminded that those prophets also fortold the coming of one who would prepare the way for the Christ, and that is John the Baptist, for whom we light the candle of Love next week.

"Christingle" simply means "Christ Light", it is thought that the custom began in the Moravian Church in Germany, allegedly as part of a Christmas Children's Festival on December 24th, 1747. The Christingle certainly became very popular in the Moravian Church and spread to other countries, finally making it to England in 1968, thanks to John Pensom of the Children's Society. Many of us will have clear recollections of past services, whether as an enthralled child, embarrassed parent or proud grandparent. Even those services that went a little 'off track' stick in the mind; children with a 'suger-rush', or the need for fire extinguishers! Whatever our personal experiences, there is little doubt that Christingles are a memorable way to explain the meaning of Christmas.

How does a Christingle represent Christmas?

- The orange symbolises the world God created; for that purpose any fruit could serve, but dried oranges have been used in Christmas decorations for hundreds of years.
- The red ribbon around the middle represents the blood of Christ, to remind us that the journey that starts at Christmas leads to Easter.
- The cocktail sticks represent both the compass points, again reminding us of the global message, and the four seasons, a sign that Christ is with us at all times.
- The fruit and/or sweets we put on the cocktail sticks represent both God's gifts to us & the fruits of the Spirit;
- Centrally the candle symbolises Jesus, the Light of the World.

Today we also celebrate baptism, one of the foundational sacraments of Christianity, which is symbolised again with the giving of a candle.

Sometimes we forget that this is a sacrament for all present, yes we focus on those who baptism we celebrate, but the whole congregation have promises to make in the support of the newly dedicated Christian. The reading from 2 Peter, however, reminds us of the people we should try to be, looking to the present whilst hoping for the promised future.

We often fall short of our own standards, let alone the ideal presented in the life of Christ, but we have the assurance that; with him beside us to light our way, we can achieve all things, and that because of all Christ did for us we can turn to him for forgiveness whenever we forget that. History of Christingle

Christingle was established by the Moravian Church in 1747 as a symbol of Christ's light and love. The Children's Society introduced it to the Church of England in 1968 and it has since become a popular family and community event.

The prophets who foretold the birth of Jesus

Leader: May your hearts be filled with peace as you hear the words of the prophet Isaiah who told of one who would be born the Prince of Peace.

All: Thanks be to God

Leader: Last Sunday we lit the First Candle of Hope in our Advent Wreath, and celebrated the patriarchs. We light it again as we place our hope in Jesus the blessing of God for all nations. (A person now lights the first candle)

The prophet Isaiah said

For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the increase of his government and peace there will be no end. He will reign on David's throne and over his kingdom, establishing and upholding it with justice and righteousness from that time on and forever. The zeal of the LORD Almighty will accomplish this.

Today, as we light the Second Candle of Advent, we remember the prophets who spoke of the coming of Christ. They told of how a Saviour would be born, a king in the line of King David. The prophet Isaiah called Christ "the Prince of Peace" and told us how he would rule the world wisely and bless all the nations.

All: Lord Jesus, Light of the World, the prophets said you would bring peace and save your people. Give peace in our hearts and in our troubled world this Christmastide.
