## Christingle

### Sentence of Scripture - John Chapter 8 v 12

Jesus spoke again to the people, He said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."

### Collect Prayer for the Day - Before we read we pray

O Lord, raise up, we pray, your power and come among us, and with great might succour us; that whereas, through our sins and wickedness we are grievously hindered in running the race that is set before us, your bountiful grace and mercy may speedily help and deliver us; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, to whom with you and the Holy Spirit, be honour and glory, now and for ever. Amen

### First Bible Reading - Isaiah Chapter 11:1-10

A shoot will come up from the stump of Jesse; from his roots a Branch will bear fruit. The Spirit of the LORD will rest on him- the Spirit of wisdom and of understanding, the Spirit of counsel and of power, the Spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the LORD - and he will delight in the fear of the LORD. He will not judge by what he sees with his eyes, or decide by what he hears with his ears; but with righteousness he will judge the needy, with justice he will give decisions for the poor of the earth. He will strike the earth with the rod of his mouth; with the breath of his lips he will slay the wicked. Righteousness will be his belt and faithfulness the sash around his waist. The wolf will live with the lamb, the leopard will lie down with the goat, the calf and the lion and the yearling together; and a little child will lead them. The cow will feed with the bear, their young will lie down together, and the lion will eat straw like the ox. The infant will play near the hole of the cobra, and the young child put his hand into the viper's nest. They will neither harm nor destroy on all my holy mountain, for the earth will be full of the knowledge of the LORD as the waters cover the sea. In that day the Root of Jesse will stand as a banner for the peoples; the nations will rally to him, and his place of rest will be glorious. This is the Word of the Lord— **Thanks be to God**)



### Second Reading - Romans Chapter 15:4-13

For everything that was written in the past was written to teach us, so that through endurance and the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope. May the God who gives endurance and encouragement give you a spirit of unity among yourselves as you follow Christ Jesus, so that with one heart and mouth you may glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. Accept one another, then, just as Christ accepted you, in order to bring praise to God. For I tell you that Christ has become a servant of the Jews on behalf of God's truth, to confirm the promises made to the patriarchs so that the Gentiles may glorify God for his mercy, as it is written: "Therefore I will praise you among the Gentiles; I will sing hymns to your name." Again, it says, "Rejoice, O Gentiles, with his people." And again, "Praise the Lord, all you Gentiles, and sing praises to him, all you peoples." And again, Isaiah says, "The Root of Jesse will spring up, one who will arise to rule over the nations; the Gentiles will hope in him." May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. (This is the Word of the Lord— **Thanks be to God**)

### Gospel Reading - Matthew Chapter 3:1-12

In those days John the Baptist came, preaching in the Desert of Judea and saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is near." This is he who was spoken of through the prophet Isaiah: "A voice of one calling in the desert, 'Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him.' "

John's clothes were made of camel's hair, and he had a leather belt around his waist. His food was locusts and wild honey. People went out to him from Jerusalem and all Judea and the whole region of the Jordan. Confessing their sins, they were baptized by him in the Jordan River. But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to where he was baptizing, he said to them: "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath? Produce fruit in keeping with repentance. And do not think you can say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father.' I tell you that out of these stones God can raise up children for Abraham. The axe is already at the root of the trees, and every tree that does not produce good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire. "I baptize you with water for repentance. But after me will come one who is more powerful than I, whose sandals I am not fit to carry. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor, gathering his wheat into the barn and burning up the chaff with unquenchable fire."

(This is the Word of the Lord—**Thanks be to God** )

## Commentary

Our readings today point to new things — new values — a new way of life that is for living here and now, not merely a hope for the distant future. God's kingdom really is here and now.

Charlie, our vicar, wrote last year

*"The kingdom breaks into our lives every day and we do not need to ask when it will come. The kingdom seizes us embraces us, challenges us, in the ordinary events of life. A sick friend, a discouraged spouse, a troublesome person on the telephone, a demand which is made on us which we think to be unfair. Situations which cause us to question how we will respond. Times when we can perhaps do much good with very little effort. How we react determines and tests our faith and questions our membership of the Kingdom. These are the places where we really show God's loving power coming through in our lives. It is as we do this of course that we become like John the Baptist in declaring God and proclaiming the coming of our Lord. Our life, our deeds our words, all speaking of the Kingdom of God. It is when we do this that are perhaps the most powerful advertisement for our Lord, in so doing we make straight paths which perhaps allow others to see more easily the living Lord, the worship of whom transcends human religion."*

And it makes a difference. Just consider some of the words in Isaiah 11; righteousness, justice and faithfulness. Do they characterise our lives and the life of the world currently? What a difference there would be if they did! And in picture form we have the view of a new order- with the wolf living with the lamb and the leopard with the goat. They will neither harm nor destroy, says Isaiah, *"for the earth will be full of the knowledge of the land as the waters cover the sea."* Everything totally enfolded in God's love and light. We sometimes sing

*"At the name of Jesus every knee shall bow ..... every tongue confess him King of glory now."*

In Romans we read that we are to *"accept one another, just a Christ accepted you."* Yes, we are accepted by God: he offers us a transforming friendship as he fills us with joy and peace - and so may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. Something here of the lines of the hymn *"Take from our souls the strain and stress and let our ordered lives confess the beauty of Thy peace."* It is for all - Jews and Gentiles - the near and the far-off- especially the last. For John came to call people back - to turn around - to repent. He talks of judgement - of consequences. I quote our Vicar again from last year;

*John the Baptist challenged people to think differently. The Beatitudes for example are a complete reversal of normal human standards: God's ways are different from many of the accepted norms of society, and that has always been the case. Society has never thought that the meek were blessed, or that there was blessing in mourning or poverty. This Christmas we must all try to think of ways in which we can be prepared and help prepare the way of the Lord; be modern day John the Baptists. It may be that we have to ring somebody up and try and rebuild broken relationships. It might be that we can offer some of our time to support community groups or a charitable organisation.*

*John had a message directed very forcefully towards the religious people, it was for them that he saved his most vehement statements. Everybody had to 'make straight paths for the Lord.'*

We are tempted sometimes to think that scriptures are directed at people outside the church, to imagine that we are the good ones and that the challenge is to [people outside the church]. The teachings of Jesus were always strongest to those who were most religious. So we ask ourselves this morning whether we have paths which are suitable for the coming of our Lord this Christmas? A lady said to me the other day that we ought to say only what we know to be a) True : b) kind and c) necessary. It makes you think how silent we'd be and how empty our newspapers !!! And yet Christmas and our preparation for it is good news. God reveals his love to us in Jesus. This is what we did last Christmas Day—Twitter sermons!

## **Meditation    The Christingle**

God so loved the world that he sent his only son to be our 'Christ Light' Saviour

**The Christingle orange** represents the world, John reminds us that 'Jesus was in the world, and though the world was made through Him, the world did not recognise Him. He came to that which was His own, but his own did not receive Him.' (John 1 v 10-11)

**The red ribbon of the Christingle** represents the blood of Jesus shed for us so that our sins may be forgiven. 'But we walk in the light, as He is the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, His Son, purifies us from every sin.' (1John 1 v 7)

**The fruits and sweets on the four skewers** represent God's gifts to us, the fruits of the earth and the four seasons. 'As long as the earth endures, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night will never cease.' (Gen 8 v 22)

**The lighted candle**, pushed into the centre of the orange represents Christ, the light of the world. 'He (Jesus) said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."' (John 8 v 12).

## **The Methodist Church has launched a consultation on the implications of same sex marriage legislation for the Methodist Church.**

The Methodist Conference asked a working group to look at the implications of the Marriage (Same Sex Couples) Act for the Methodist Church back in July. The group's task is to report on whether the Conference should embark on a process of reviewing the Church's position on marriage and on civil partnerships. The consultation is open to Methodists and will run until early February.

Susan Howdle, chair of the same sex marriage and civil partnership working party, said: "The working party has begun its consultations by meeting a few pilot groups as well as having very lively conversations at 3Generate 2013 Children's and Youth Assembly. From this, we have begun to identify some of the key implications which the legislation poses for our Church. We are now embarking on wider consultation, trying to fulfill our brief to be as open and inclusive as possible."

Following agreement by the House of Lords and the House of Commons, the Marriage (Same Sex Couples) Bill received Royal Assent on 17 July. The Act makes provision for the marriage of same-sex couples in England and Wales.

Susan Howdle continued: "We do urge as many Methodists as possible to respond, thoughtfully and prayerfully, to the consultation in order to help us to gauge the mind of the Church. We hope the time scale will allow at least some of the responses to be from groups who have met for discussion, but individual responses are equally welcome." ## We thank God for Madiba

'Humanity, courage, generosity': Archbishop Justin's statement following death of Nelson Mandela. Offering prayers to the family, friends and country of Nelson Mandela, who died today, the Archbishop of Canterbury said

Mandela's life challenges us to show 'the same degree of humanity, courage and generosity. The death of President Nelson Mandela was announced in memorable words by President Zuma. South Africa has lost its greatest citizen and its father. Nelson Mandela, fighting to the end, is freed to be with his God in joy and reward for his great service and sacrifice. We pray for his family, for his friends and for his country. We are challenged to show the same degree of humanity, of courage and of generosity.'

Some have said Mandela's 27 years in jail were a waste, suggesting that if had he been released earlier he would have had more time to weave his charm of forgiveness and reconciliation. I beg to differ. He went to jail an angry young man, incensed by the miscarriage of justice in the travesty of the Rivonia Trial. He was no peace maker. After all, he had been MK commander and intended to overthrow apartheid by force. The 27 years were absolutely crucial in his spiritual development. The suffering was the crucible that removed considerable dross, giving him empathy for his opponents. It helped to ennoble him, imbuing him with magnanimity difficult to gain in other ways. It gave him an authority and credibility that otherwise would have been difficult to attain. No one could challenge his credentials. He had proved his commitment and selflessness through what he had undergone. He had the authority and attractiveness that accompany vicarious suffering on behalf of others – as with Mahatma Gandhi, Mother Teresa and the Dalai Lama.

We were spellbound on Sunday February 11 1990 when the world came to a standstill and waited for him to emerge from prison. When he came out with Winnie by his side we were united in our admiration. What bliss to be alive, to experience that moment! We felt proud to be human because of this amazing man. For a moment, we all believed that it is possible to be good. We thought enemies could become friends, as we followed Madiba in the path of forgiveness and reconciliation exemplified by the truth commission and a polyglot national anthem, 11 official languages, and a government of national unity in which the last apartheid president could be a deputy president and a "terrorist" the head of government. He was amazing. Madiba lived what he preached. Had he not invited his former white jailer as a VIP guest to his presidential inauguration? Did he not have lunch with Percy Yutar, the prosecutor at the Rivonia trial? Had he not flown to Orania, the last Afrikaner outpost, to have tea with Betsy Verwoerd, the widow of the high priest of apartheid ideology? He was amazing. ....

We thank God for you, Madiba. May you rest in peace and rise in glory.
